





On The Way

Figures of the Resurrection: The Disciples

In the accounts of the resurrection appearances, we hear not only of individuals (e.g., Mary Magdalene, Peter) or of the Apostles (at the Sea of Tiberias) but also of the larger group of Christ's disciples. We know that they were gathered together in the Upper Room on Easter day and again a week after. The two disciples ran back from Emmaus to Jerusalem, "where they found gathered together the eleven *and those with them*" (Lk 24:33). Most notably – and most relevant for us as we approach Pentecost – there were about one hundred twenty gathered in the Upper Room awaiting the gift of the Spirit after our Lord's Ascension.

We learn from this larger group of mostly unnamed disciples, first, the importance of being gathered together. Sin divides. It set Adam and Eve at odds, and then Cain and Abel, and then precipitated the scattering of the nations at Babel. Christ unites us. Or, better, He makes us one in Him. Pope Leo's episcopal motto is *In Illo uno unum*. It's a quote from Saint Augustine and typical of his pithy style. It means, "In Him the One, we are one." Which means not only that He makes us one but that only in Him can we be truly one. No social or political or economic force can establish the oneness that Christ brings.

Sin divides, and the ultimate division is death, the separation of body and soul. Christ risen from the dead announces the healing of that deepest division and thus the possibility of oneness willed from the beginning. So the oneness of the Church's members is not just a matter of everybody being nice and getting along. It is a sign of the healing He has accomplished. The very oneness of the Church announces the Savior Who has conquered death and heals division.

Second, the disciples reveal to us the need for prayer in our oneness. "All these devoted themselves with one accord to prayer" (Acts 2:14). This means, as is painfully obvious, that we need to pray for the oneness of the Church. The healing of divisions among Christians will ultimately come not by human effort but by His grace.

Further, the oneness of His disciples is also for the purpose of prayer. Saint Paul describes the one Church made one in Christ in just this way: "So then you are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the holy ones and members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the capstone. Through him the whole structure is held together and grows into a temple sacred in the Lord; in him you also are being built together into a dwelling place of God in the Spirit" (Eph 2:19-22).

Finally, the disciples after the resurrection show us the importance of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Other than the Apostles, she is the only disciple mentioned by name during this time of prayer. This reveals our Lady as a principal of unity. The disciples have a shared devotion to her as the Mother of the one true God. They naturally turn to her as her Son departs this world. And they find in her the perfect example of prayer.

Indeed, they see themselves in her because Mary is the image of the Church. She is one, whole and entire, in her devotion to the Lord and thus reveals the essential oneness of the Church. Her perpetual virginity is a sign of this wholeness and oneness. Her prayer is an image of the Church's prayer. As in Nazareth, so in the Upper Room she receives the Holy Spirit and responds fully. Thus does the one Church now await that same gift.


Food Distribution Donations for June
