On The Way

The Apostles: Peter the Rock

The Gospels present Peter as a natural leader, one to whom other men instinctively deferred and followed. Christ built on those natural gifts to make Peter something more, even the leader of His Church.

The pivotal scene regarding Peter's headship is Jesus' conversation with the Apostles at Caesarea Philippi (see Mt 16:13-19). He asks them who people think He is. And everyone has it wrong. They think He's John the Baptist, or Elijah, or Jeremiah or another prophet. Jesus turns to His closest friends, perhaps desiring that at least *someone* get it, and asks, "But who do you [plural] say that I am?" Stepping forward on behalf of all, Peter responds, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

Before addressing the theological implications of this exchange, let's pause to appreciate it as a conversation between friends. Because Jesus' election of Peter is within the context of friendship. Now, friends want to be known by one another. Christ's Sacred Heart longs to be known by His closest companions. Intensely devoted to Jesus, Peter shows himself a good friend by knowing Christ and speaking the truth about Him. His response must have brought some degree of consolation to our Lord's Heart.

Jesus immediately rewards Peter's profession of faith with an expression of divine approval: "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jona!" He then affirms that Peter had spoken not from mere human wisdom but from divine enlightenment: "For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father who is in heaven." Peter is the Father's instrument to make this confession of faith before others.

Jesus then makes a solemn declaration about Peter himself: "And I tell you, you are Peter..." The name means "Rock." Jesus spoke of this name change at their first meeting (see Jn 1:42). Now He proclaims it solemnly. In Scripture, a change of name indicates a change of mission or, perhaps more accurately, a change of the person for a new mission. Abram became Abraham and Jacob became Israel. Now Simon's new name expresses his new mission: "and on this rock I will build my church." Simon now must be Peter – a rock – for the good of others, to provide a firm foundation for their faith.

Notice how Jesus confirms Peter's words by mirroring them with His own. *You are the Christ* is confirmed by *You are Peter*. As Peter explained that the Christ was *the Son of the living God*, so now Jesus explains that *on this rock [peter] I will build my Church*. Jesus here expresses the divine will to establish a Church. He has come to found something lasting, not just to spend some time here and then disappear. Peter is that foundation.

He goes on to describe the solidity of that foundation: "and the powers of death shall not prevail against it." The presumption here is that the powers of death *will* assault and batter the Church. We shouldn't be surprised by assaults and even some damage. But they will never overcome her.

Our Lord concludes His promise to Peter, "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." The keys signify authority. In the ancient world, the gates of a city would be closed and locked at night. The man who held the keys had great authority. Our Lord is now conferring that authority on Peter *for the kingdom of heaven*. This authority means that Peter's decisions have eternal significance and power. Further, the phrase "to bind and loose" was a term that indicated the power of Jewish leaders to make authoritative interpretations. Now for the New Israel that is entrusted to Peter.



The MSV emphasizes providing true end-of-life care through hospice and palliative medicine. Not all in the medical profession agree.
