## On The Way

*The Apostles: John the Beloved*

*The disciple whom Jesus loved...* John uses that phrase several times in his Gospel to refer to...*himself*. Now, it would be impious to think that he does so out of pride and intends it as a boast. It could be just a humble statement of fact. Humility, after all, is recognition of the truth. But why call attention to this truth, even humbly? So, we come to another, better reason for his using the phrase. He intends it to describe not only himself but every disciple of the Lord. Because we are all beloved disciples and are called to live as such. In this phrase we find a description of how to do so, of what should characterize us beloved disciples.

John's first use of the phrase is in his account of the Last Supper. After Jesus speaks of His betrayer, the Apostles are at a loss as to whom He is referring. Peter (of course) wants to know who it is. "One of his disciples, whom Jesus loved, was lying close to the breast of Jesus; so Simon Peter beckoned to him and said, 'Tell us who it is of whom he speaks.' So lying thus, close to the breast of Jesus, he said to him, 'Lord, who is it?'" (Jn 13:24-25)

Another translation has it that John was "leaning on the breast of Jesus." That is, resting on His *Heart*. This has been understood for centuries as a first description of devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Just as Jesus is "in the bosom of the Father" (Jn 1:18), so John rests in the bosom of Christ. A beloved disciple rests upon Jesus' Heart.

Next, we hear that on Calvary at the foot of the Cross stood "his mother, and the disciple whom he loved" (Jn 19:25). Jesus then said to His mother, "'Woman, behold, your son!' Then he said to the disciple, 'Behold, your mother!' And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home" (Jn 19:26-27). Literally, he *took her to his own* – that is, into his life. Thus, a beloved disciple – which each of us is – takes Mary into his life as the Mother entrusted to us by Christ from the Cross. His parting gift. Devotion to Mary is essential to being a beloved disciple.

Calvary is also where the sword spoken of by Simeon (see Lk 2:35) pierces Mary's Heart. "Now at length the sword has pass'd," we sing in the Stabat Mater. Thus, a beloved disciple is devoted especially to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Then John uses the phrase to describe the disciple who outruns Peter to the tomb of our Lord. Mary Magdalene "went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him.' Peter then came out with the other disciple, and they went toward the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first" (Jn 20:1-3).

There's more going on here than just John's being younger and faster than Peter. He races because a beloved disciple is eager to see the risen Lord. Just as Mary went in haste – promptly – to visit Elizabeth (see Lk 1:39), so the disciple beloved by Christ and devoted to her hastens to rejoice in the resurrection.

Finally, at the Sea of Tiberias (see Jn 21:1-7) it is the disciple whom Jesus loved who discerns His work in their miraculous catch of fish and recognizes Him on the shore: "It is the Lord!" (21:7). So we beloved disciples should strive to discern His work and recognize the risen Lord in our lives.

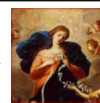

### Holy Spirit Novena

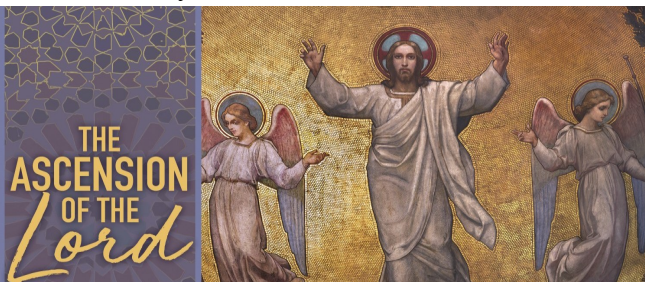

This weekend, May 9-10, is our annual *Special Parish Needs collection*. This collection is used by our Pastor for the area of greatest need in the parish. The money raised this year will be given to our vibrant Social Outreach Committee to continue its work on behalf of our parishioners and the broader Falls Church community. From the time of its founding in 1892, Saint James Catholic Church has always attended to the needs of the poor and suffering. Our Social Outreach Committee puts into action the Corporal Works of Mercy through food, clothing, and personal hygiene donations, monthly Food Distribution, supporting a local homeless shelter in the winter months, and yearly collection of Lenten and Advent gift cards to assist local shelters. ## **Diocesan Retired Priests Collection May 16-17**

Next weekend, May 16-17, there will be a second collection for our diocesan retired priests. This collection is an opportunity for you to give back to our retired priests who have given the greater part of their lives to serve each of you and our diocesan Church.

Many elder religious worked for years for little to no pay, leaving a large gap in retirement savings. Like many Americans, religious communities face the monumental challenge of funding eldercare.



## **Saint James Charitable Works Update**

*Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.* (Matthew 25:40)

During our fiscal year through March 31st, Saint James performed the following works of mercy in our community:

- Distributed bags of food to 1,597 people through our Food Distribution program
- Provided direct financial assistance totaling \$20,162 to 94 people in need, including rental assistance, help paying bills, and motel nights for the homeless
- Prepared and delivered meals serving 80 people per month for the Christ House shelter
- Collected 11,600 pounds of food for the diocesan St. Lucy Food Project
- Visited and brought cheer to 18 homebound parishioners
- Collected and distributed 297 gift cards to four homeless shelters
- Provided cleaning supplies, linens, and food to 74 families at Fair Ridge Family Shelter
- Collected hygiene products for Catholic Charities in November and March
- Provided 290 Christmas presents to poor families at Luther Jackson Middle School
- Provided Friday meals for the Falls Church Homeless Shelter
- Creation Care ministry donated 270 pounds of produce to Food for Others
- Hosted a festive St. Patrick's Day party for 45 seniors at the Winter Hill Senior Center
- Provided funds to Food for Others, the Falls Church Community Service Council, and the Falls Church Homeless Shelter
