## On The Way

*The Apostles: Saint Andrew*

Andrew was a fisherman in Bethsaida, on the northern coast of the Sea of Galilee. Jesus called him from the boat, with his brother Peter, to follow Him. But we first meet Andrew as a disciple of John the Baptist at the Jordan river (see Jn 1:35-41). He was one of the two disciples who heard the Baptist point to Jesus and proclaim, "Behold, the Lamb of God." He and John followed Jesus and spent some time with Him. After this encounter, Andrew found his brother Peter and declared, "We have found the Messiah." Then "He brought him to Jesus."

*He brought him to Jesus.* These words summarize Andrew. In the few accounts we have of him he is always bringing people to Jesus. Just as importantly, he seems to have had the kind personality and character that made people feel comfortable approaching him about Jesus. He's the kind of guy who's always making introductions but never putting himself forward. He's central without being the center of attention.

Although Peter is head of the Apostles, it's his brother Andrew who meets our Lord first. He is, according to the Greek expression, *Prōtoklētos* – *The First Called*. But more important is Andrew's habit of calling others to Christ. He's not only the First Called but also the First Caller. As such, he provides a great example of what it means to be apostolic. This Apostle highlights what should characterize every apostolic soul.

First, the apostolic soul seeks Christ. Andrew's first words – *We have found the Messiah* – indicate that he and the others were waiting and searching for the Messiah. Andrew in particular was seeking the Messiah to such a degree that he would make the journey of several days, from one end of the Sea of Galilee to the other, to see if John the Baptist might be the one. But having learned from John about the true Christ, he then brought Him to others. *We have found the Messiah*. They found Messiah by God's providence, and not by accident. And God's providence included their awaiting and seeking Him.

Second, the apostolic soul knows Christ. When he first meets Jesus, Andrew says, "Rabbi, where are you staying?" (Jn 1:38) Literally, *Where do you abide?* It's a question about the very dwelling place of God. They then stay with Him and come to know Him personally. The Apostle knows the One to Whom he brings others.

Third, the apostolic soul wants to bring others to Christ. Andrew does just that when the crowds follow Jesus out to "a lonely place apart" (Mt 14:13). Jesus tests the Apostles by asking, "How are we to buy bread, so that these people may eat?" (Jn 6:5) It is Andrew who comes forward with a boy who has five barley loaves and two fish. Again, *he brought him to Jesus*. And by bringing the boy to Jesus Andrew sets in motion one of our Lord's most important miracles.

Later, during our Lord's final days in Jerusalem, some Greeks come to Philip with the wonderful plea, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus" (Jn 12:21). Philip's response is simple but telling: he goes to Andrew. There again Andrew is the approachable man who simply brings people to Jesus. He's not cliquish but generous. He wants to share the goodness of what he's found, to make introductions, to bring more people into friendship with Christ.

Finally, the apostolic soul is approachable. There must have been something about Andrew that prompted that boy to approach him and trust him with the five loaves and two fish. Knowledge of Christ and the desire need that natural, human friendliness that makes the Gospel more attractive. May Andrew intercede to gain us the desire to know Christ and make Him known.

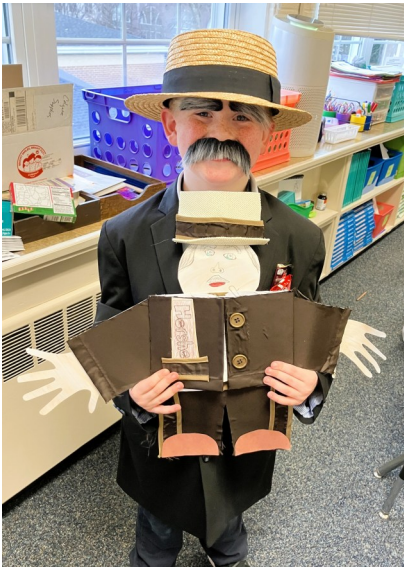
# 17th Annual Fish Fry Memories

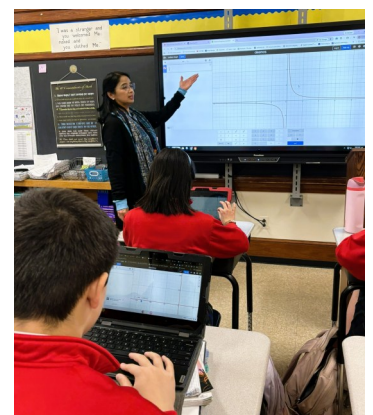
