



### On The Way

Faith is personal

"Without faith it is impossible to please [God]" (Heb 11:6). Those are sobering words from Scripture about not just the importance but the necessity of faith. It is the foundational virtue of the Christian, without which hope and charity are simply not possible. Without faith, we don't know what we should hope for. Hence the Letter to Hebrews says, "faith is the assurance of things hoped for" (Heb 11:1). Without faith we don't know how, what, and whom to love. You cannot love what you do not know, and faith is "evidence of things not seen" (Heb 11:1).

A striking aspect of the Gospels is the personal commitment of faith that Jesus seeks. His miracles are worked on the basis of people's faith in him. When two blind men follow him and cry out for pity, he asks them bluntly, "Do you believe that I can do this?" (Mt 9:28) He's not asking for opinion or feeling but a *personal* act of trust in him. Likewise at the tomb of Lazarus, Jesus says to Martha, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" (Jn 11:25-26)

The Latin word for believe – *credere* – is where we get our word "credit." To give credit means to entrust something to someone. To have credit means that people trust you enough to give you something now in view of some future payment. So, to believe means to credit something – our very selves – to God himself. "I believe" means more than "I feel" or "I think." It means *I entrust myself* to this person. Or, in our case, to three Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

An important correction made to the English text of the Mass some years ago was to change the Creed from "We believe" to "I believe." It's more faithful to the Latin and in that way it emphasizes the personal dimension of the prayer. I can't believe for you and you can't believe for me. Each of us must profess the faith personally.

One consequence of faith's personal dimension is the need for prayer. Faith without prayer is an impossibility. Nobody loses his faith the way he loses his keys. A man loses his faith because he stops praying. If you do not pray, then you do not believe...or you will not believe much longer. Without prayer, the things of faith might remain, but faith itself becomes an ideology. Or, more likely, it becomes enslaved to a secular ideology.

Earlier this year, the famous atheist Richard Dawkins identified himself as a "cultural Christian" and lamented the decline of Christian culture in the West. That demonstrates precisely this point, that Christianity without faith is an impossibility. It's impossible to have the trappings of Christianity without Christian faith. No matter how much Dawkins might want the artistic patrimony, the charitable works, and the freedom of a Christian culture...you cannot have them without Christian faith.

And there is no Christian faith without prayer. So, one concrete way to guard and strengthen our faith is to pray. You can pray the Apostles or the Nicene Creed. Those aren't just a list of doctrines but an act of faith, an entrustment of self to God. You can pray the Act of Faith itself (on the prayer card in the pews). Or most simply you can pray the anguished prayer of the father in the Gospels, pleading for his tormented son: "I believe; help my unbelief!" (Mk 9:24) indeed, that brief petition is wonderfully precise. By way of Baptism, you have the virtue of faith. You do believe in some way. But that needs to be strengthened and to grow.

#### Register for WorkCamp by February 14th

Registration for WorkCamp is now open for all high school teens currently in grades 9-12. WorkCamp will be held from June 21-27, 2025, in Frederick County, Virginia. The cost for each teen (and adult leader) is \$575 with a \$50 deposit. Saint James will be advancing the \$50 deposit. This group will be defraying the cost through fundraisers. Teens and parents participating in the fundraisers will have their costs reduced through funds collected. There will be monthly meetings until June. Teens should attend as many as possible.

Each parent should plan to volunteer in some way such as helping with fundraising, spending one afternoon at camp as a security volunteer, being a crew leader, or helping in some other way. **The diocesan deadline to register is February 14, 2025.** 

We need to secure adult volunteers since the number of students who can go to WorkCamp is dependent on how many adult volunteers come.

- For every 1-5 girls, we need one adult female crew leader.
- For every 1-5 boys, we need one adult male crew leader.
- In addition, for every 1-5 teens, we need one contractor.

If you are 25 or older, please consider volunteering as a crew leader to join us for the week, or if you have basic home repair or building skills, please consider volunteering your time as a contractor (Monday-Thursday). WorkCamp is a big commitment, but it comes with lots of personal rewards.
