On The Way

The Theological Virtues: Loving God in Ourselves

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind...You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Mt 22:37, 39). That little phrase — as yourself — indicates a third commandment between the first and the second, between God and neighbor. We are to love ourselves. The Pharisees and Sadducees had asked for one commandment. Jesus gave them two...and then slipped in a third.

Now, self-love is a tricky thing. Somewhere Saint Thomas Aquinas says that the more necessary a thing is, the more important that it be governed by reason. That principle applies powerfully to self-love. Self-love is indeed necessary. The lack of it, as our Lord's commandment indicates, inhibits our ability to love others. And because it is so necessary, all the more does it need to be governed properly. We know well what damage the wrong kind of self-love causes.

First, we have to recall that all loves derive from our love of God. We love Him above all else and everything else because of Him. If we love anything apart from him, we make that thing into a god...and thus, a demon. The reason we are to love ourselves is not because we are perfect or the greatest or smartest...and so on. It's because God loves us first and has created us to love Him. Because we love God we ought to love what He loves — again, beginning with ourselves. Self-love's importance flows from the prior command to love God. We don't love Him properly if we don't love what He loves.

Christian self-love is the loving of oneself because we are loved by God. And there's the problem. We try to love ourselves for something less than our being loved by God. We love ourselves for some natural gift or talent, some worldly accomplishment, some promotion or line on the resume, some praise we receive from others. Any of those can be lost at any moment. They will all be lost in the end. Our sense of self is unstable until and unless we see ourselves in God and loved by Him.

We should distinguish this proper self-love from "Narcissism," which describes excessive or disordered self-love. The Greek myth of Narcissus recounts how, as the beautiful young man gazed into the still water, he fell in love with his own reflection. He couldn't bear to break himself away and thus became rooted to the spot. Like many of the pagan myths, this contains a truth. Loving ourselves apart from God paralyzes us. Which leads to the next point.

Self-love impacts our ability to love others. If we don't know and share God's love for us, then we won't love others rightly either. This is why self-love comes between love of God and love of neighbor. Saint Catherine of Siena observes that we love others with the same love with which we see ourselves loved. This might be hard for many of us. The doubt about our being loved or our ability to be loved prompts us to pull back and not engage with others...or to overcompensate and intrude. The secret of the saints is that they knew themselves as loved by God. And not superficially but with the in-the-marrow-of-the-bones kind of knowledge. Because they knew His love for them, they could love themselves properly and then love others with great freedom and generosity.

So, here's another good Lenten prayer: *That I know God's love for me so that I can properly love myself*. Our meditation on His Passion, our praying the Stations of the Cross, our walking with Him during Holy Week should form in each of us the knowledge of this simple truth: "God loved me and gave himself up for me" (Gal 2:20).

This week's Lenten recipe is a delicious and versatile Oat Focaccia, an Italian flatbread, that can be enjoyed by itself or with a number of spreads and accompaniments. The ingredients are listed below.

Oat Focaccia Adapted from @Roving Haggis

- Porridge
 50 g fine oatmeal
 150 ml water
 15 ml olive oil
- Dough
 500 g bread flour
 400 ml water
 1 tsp sugar
 12 g salt
 Olive oil for garnish
 Coarse sea salt for garnish


Understanding the Ramifications of the Proposed VA Constitutional Amendment on Abortion—The proposed amendment is broadly written, and it will be left to judges to interpret its meaning in the future. This opens the door for harmful interpretations of the wording by our courts. Below is another danger in the VA abortion amendment.

The amendment gives some examples of "reproductive freedom" such as abortion and contraception. But ultimately, "reproductive freedom" could be expanded by the courts to include abortion, all forms of contraception, sterilization, and sex change surgeries for all minor children without requiring parental consent. Proponents may argue that there is not language in the face of this amendment that will overturn parental rights, but parental rights will suffer "death by adjudication" as lawsuits are brought in court. Remember that the Virginia State Constitution supersedes state statutory law.



<u>Urgent—Female Volunteers for WorkCamp</u>


