



On The Way

Redeeming Word and Body: Man's Communication, cont'd

God creates by His word: "God said, 'Let there be light'; and there was light." And so He did for the sky, the seas, the earth, fish, birds, and animals – and man. God's very word is creative. Now, since man is created in the image and after the likeness of God, it should not surprise us to find a similar trait in him. And so we do.

"So out of the ground the LORD God formed every beast of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name. The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every beast of the field..." (Gen 2:19-20)

Whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name. This ability to name things – to recognize and express what is true – reflects the divine. Man has a divine prerogative that no other creature has, to communicate by word. Now, man doesn't quite call things into being by his word. But his speech does have power. It has the power to articulate and communicate the truth around him. He can both perceive reality and express it to others.

Then, at the end of this same scene from Genesis, we hear Scripture's first recorded words of man. When woman is brought to man, he exclaims, "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man" (Gen 2:23). These words are not just a statement but a little poem or verse – in effect, a hymn of praise to God for woman. As such, they capture the meaning of man's gift of speech. He uses his words to articulate the truth about God's gift of woman and thus to give Him praise.

Truth is the correspondence of our minds with reality. Created in God's image, we have an intellect to know the truth. We are given the further gift of speech so that our words have power to convey the truth to God and to one another.

When our words rise up and we speak the truth to God, it has the character of praise and thanksgiving. To speak the truth to God is simply to acknowledge Him as Creator and Lord, to proclaim the goodness of His creation, to name Him as goodness itself. Indeed, by our words all of creation finds a voice of praise and thanksgiving to the Creator. All of creation is mute until and unless we do so. This is part of what it means for man to have dominion over the earth. It is so that all the irrational creatures can be incorporated into man's rational worship of the Creator.

When our words go out to one another, when we speak the truth to one another, we deepen and extend the bonds of our relationships. Regarding their bodies, we're told "the man and his wife were both naked, and were not ashamed" (Gen 2:25). Although nothing is recorded about their conversations, perhaps we can say a similar thing about their speech: there was no shame in their words to one another. They spoke plainly and truthfully, aware of God's goodness and wanting to share it with one another. As their bodies spoke about how they were created for one another, how they are God's gift to one another, so also their words surely followed suit. To speak in such a manner is, after all, why God has given us this likeness to Him.







This weekend, our second collection will be for the Retired Religious Fund. Saint James takes up this collection each year for our retired priests and religious. Sadly, changing demographics, rising health care costs, and lack of funding are making it increasingly difficult for religious orders to care for those who have given their lives to God.

During the early and mid-twentieth centuries, the Catholic Church in the United States experienced a surge in vocations to religious life, with numbers peaking in the mid-1960s. Care for elderly members was provided largely by younger members. Over time, however, the number of vocations decreased while lifespans increased. The result is fewer younger members available to support the retirement and eldercare needs of senior members. Currently, 71% of the religious communities have a median age of 70 or older.

Diocesan Vocational Program Survey

In November 2022, Bishop Burbidge presented 23 strategic initiatives to the People of God in the Diocese of Arlington. Among those 23 initiatives was one exploring the interest of a Catholic-based Vocational Program in the diocese.
