## On The Way

*The Seven Last Words: It is finished*

This word might strike us as unnecessary. What need is there for a crucified man to announce the end of his life, that it is finished? Anyone could see that. Once the death sentence was announced he was, as the saying goes, a “dead man walking.” Clearly, then, this word must mean more than just “It’s over.” Indeed, “It is finished” means *finished* not in the sense of being over, but of being completed, fulfilled, and accomplished. He means not that the Crucifixion ends something but that it completes and fulfills it. But what exactly? What has he fully accomplished – finished – on the Cross?

First, and most importantly, Jesus fulfills and completes the work of redemption, which consists of the full offering of himself to his Father for our sake. It is the obedience of the Son to the Father, accomplished in the offering of his life in the Passion, that redeems us from sin and death. In the Garden of Gethsemane, he had prayed, “Abba, Father, all things are possible to you. Take this cup away from me, but not what I will but what you will” (Mk 14:36). On the Cross, that trust in his Father (his *Abba* or *Daddy*) and obedience to his will is fulfilled and completed.

This obedience of the Son to the Father is not one of slavery. It comes from his love for the Father. Indeed, it’s his *nourishment*: “My food is to do the will of him who sent me, and to accomplish his work” (Jn 4:34). Thus, this perfect obedience finishes or completes the revelation of Jesus as the Son of the Father. “When you lift up the Son of Man, then you will realize that I AM, and that I do nothing on my own, but I say only what the Father taught me” (Jn 8:28). Now, as we see him on the Cross, as we see his full obedience, we also see the full revelation of the eternal Son.

The Crucifixion also completes Christ’s moral teachings. The execution of Socrates cut short his teaching. The execution of Jesus Christ, on the other hand, fulfills everything he taught. The Beatitudes...loving one’s enemy...forgiving those who persecute you...trusting in the Father...these are taught fully from the Cross no longer by words but by the witness of his sacrifice. The splendor of his truth shines forth with greater brilliance from the Cross.

Further, the Crucifixion completes Christ’s gift of himself to the Church. He offers his life not only to the Father for our sake but also to the Church. He accomplishes his Father’s work of salvation by becoming the Bridegroom of the Church. That spousal gift of himself to the Church is now complete. Or, according to a different translation, *It is consummated*. We say that a marriage is consummated when the husband and wife physically express their vows in the marital embrace. On the Cross, Christ the Bridegroom gives his Body to the Church his Bride. He consummates all that he proposed and promised by this gift of himself.

This “It is finished” isn’t spoken by a man who has despaired and given up. These are not words of resignation. They are spoken by a man who has given everything, even to the last drop of his Precious Blood. He reveals something that we all desire: to approach the end of our lives with that sense of fidelity and complete self-giving, that we have accomplished the work the Father has given us to do. We pray to be able to say with Saint Paul, “I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith” (2 Tim 4:7).

#### **Easy Broccoli Quiche**

8 eggs  
1 cup milk  
1 cup shredded cheddar or Mexican cheese  
1/2 head broccoli, steamed and cooled  
1/4 cup cream cheese  
1 pie crust (homemade or store-bought)

Roll out the pie crust and place it in a 9" pie plate. Whisk together the milk and eggs. Add the shredded cheese and steamed (and cooled) broccoli. Pour the egg mixture into the pie crust, and dot with cubed cream cheese. Bake at 350° for 55 minutes.

## Dominican Corner

### St. Chiara Gambacorti

St. Patrick isn't the only saint we remember today. St. Chiara Gambacorti (1362-1420) was a wealthy Venetian wife who soon became a widow when her husband died of the plague. Her father intended to arrange a second advantageous marriage, but Chiara felt called to the religious life. To prevent her from carrying out her wishes, he locked her in a dark room. Five months later, he asked a visiting bishop to talk some sense into his daughter, but the bishop instead encouraged the girl to pursue her call to religious life. With the encouragement of her friend Catherine of Siena, Chiara was received as a Dominican at the age of 16 in 1372.

## WorkCamp Male Crew Leader Needed ASAP

We are in immediate need of another male Adult Crew Leader. **Without another male volunteer, we will be forced to reduce our number of male youths.**

Here is a description of what an adult crew leader does and the requirements:

- Adult Crew Leaders are adults who work well with high school aged young people. **Adult Crew Leaders make WorkCamp possible.**
- Adult Crew Leaders must be registered prior to attending the Adult Crew Leader meeting on March 20th.
- They will help supervise the young people 24 hours a day for the entire time we are at WorkCamp. They will supervise a small group (the crew) at the work site and be responsible for groups from their parish at Homebase.
- Adult Crew Leaders must be 25 years of age or older.
- Adult Crew Leaders should attend all WorkCamp parish preparation meetings so they are prepared for the experience and be part of the formation with the young people from their parish WorkCamp group.
- Adult Crew Leaders are encouraged to attend the April Stakeholder meeting.
  - ◊ Attendance at the Adult Leader Formation Meeting on March 20th is MANDATORY.
  - ◊ Any Adult Crew Leader who misses this training, for any reason, cannot come to WorkCamp, which will impact the number of teens the parish may bring to WorkCamp.

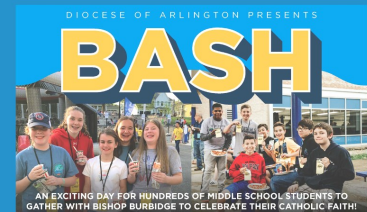

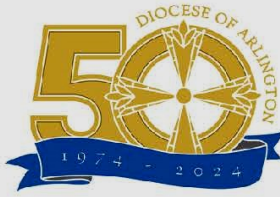

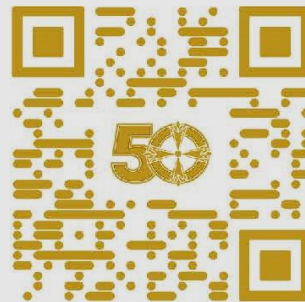
