

On The Way

The Anima Christi: Passion of Christ, strengthen me.

Dr. Alice von Hildebrand passed away in 2022. She was the wife of the famous and influential Catholic philosopher Dietrich von Hildebrand. But she was a first-rate philosopher in her own right – and a holy woman. When she was in the hospital some years ago, a priest called to arrange for a visit and bring her Holy Communion. As he was wrapping up the call, he asked, "Is there anything else you need?" She responded, "Yes, Father. Pray that I don't waste this suffering." It's an odd response to the worldly but shouldn't be to Catholics.

Suffering is one of the greatest mysteries of human life. Many spend their lives avoiding it at all costs and, when it can no longer be avoided, to rebel against it even to the point of taking one's life. Many see suffering as an obstacle to belief in God. *If a good God exists, how can he permit it?* The Church, however, doesn't regard suffering as a problem to be solved (by, for example, euthanasia) but as a mystery.

God has not "solved" human suffering or taken it away. He has sanctified it and made it a source of grace. Saint Paul wrote to the Colossians, "I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church" (Col 1:24). Now, you may not be at the point of *rejoicing* in your sufferings, but the point remains: by uniting them to Christ they become a means of interceding for the entire Church and, indeed, for the world.

Passion of Christ, strengthen me. This petition of the *Anima Christi* might strike us as odd as Dr. Alice's request. How can his passion – his suffering and death – bring strength? Why would we ask such a thing?

First, it strengthens us to know that he has suffered *for* us. The greater difficulty in our lives is not our suffering but our sinfulness. "[H]e was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that made us whole, and with his stripes we are healed" (Is 53:5). His Passion saves us from sin and death. That's the greatest comfort and strength.

It also strengthens us to know that he suffers *with* us. The Crucifix teaches us that human suffering is not something foreign or unknown to God. In Jesus Christ, all forms of human suffering – emotional, mental, physical – have been assumed by God himself. Whatever suffering we encounter, he knows it already. We find in God himself a sympathetic ear. "For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin" (Heb 4:15).

Finally, it strengthens us – as Saint Paul teaches – to know that we can offer our sufferings in union with his. Even at our most helpless, vulnerable, and forsaken we are not without power to intercede for others. That is one profound reason our Lord has given us the Mass and Holy Communion. By our participation in the Mass, we are drawn into the sacrifice of Christ precisely so that we can bring our offerings and unite them with him. By our reception of Holy Communion, we receive him who can sanctify our entire lives, even our pain, loss, abandonment, and sorrow.

Passion of Christ, strengthen me. This response was the holy intuition of Saint Teresa Benedicta. She wrote, "It is not human activity that avails, but the Passion of Christ. I wish to share it." In the Eucharist most especially, we share it. There his Passion becomes our strength.

Life Corner

Bishop Michael Burbidge reflects on the Dobbs Decision and the impact of the Eucharistic Revival on the Pro-Life Movement, June 23, 2024.



"This anniversary calls us to reflect on where we have been and where we are going. This fall, as many as ten additional states will have abortion referenda on their ballots, allowing voters to enshrine 'abortion rights' and override existing prolife safeguards. At the same time, Congress has been promoting many pro-abortion policies while largely ignoring our calls to prioritize maternal health and support for children and families in need.

In the spirit of faithful citizenship, I urge Catholics to engage their elected officials on all issues endangering life. As we navigate this shifting political landscape, I cannot help but think the Holy Spirit has inspired our National Eucharistic Revival for such a time as this. Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist has the power to transform our own hearts and the heart of our culture."


