





Redeeming Word and Body: Redeeming Priesthood 1/2

Christ extends His redemption through His Church – His very own Body that bears His word. Last week we considered how the sacrament of matrimony participates in this redemption. Next, we consider the other sacrament of service, Holy Orders – in particular, the priesthood. But first we should consider the priesthood of Christ in general and how all the faithful participate in His priesthood – and in redeeming word and body.

With matrimony, Jesus took an already existing, natural institution and elevated it to a sacrament, healing it and endowing it with power to communicate His grace. The priesthood of Jesus Christ, however, is new and not the continuation of the Old Testament priesthood. Still, His priesthood redeems and empowers something foundational.

All civilizations have had some form of priesthood. They vary in their practices, but what they all have in common is that the priest functions as the one who brings the things of man to God (petition) and the things of God to man (blessings). The ancient Romans called a priest *pontifex* – bridge builder – because he established communication between the natural and supernatural, temporal and eternal, human and divine.

In the natural order, man is the priest of all creation. The book of Genesis presents him as God's image and viceroy, by whom the supernatural is present to the natural. Adam is given the physical task “to till and keep” the garden (Gen 2:15). Those words are later used to describe the ministry of priests in the Temple of Jerusalem. Adam is likewise given the power to speak authoritatively about created things: “whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name” (Gen 2:19). In sum, by the labor of his body and by the authority of his word man brings the mute created world into coherent praise of the Creator. All creation finds voice through, with, and in him.

As with other gifts at creation, this natural priesthood is damaged by sin. Man abuses the created world by subjecting it to his own desires rather than God's glory. He abuses his speech by denying creation its voice of praise to the Creator.

The priesthood of Christ redeems this. Christ begins the revelation of His priesthood at the Last Supper, when by His words – “This is my body” (1 Cor 11:24) – He makes His Body present. He fulfills it when He offers His Body on the Cross and speaks words of praise to the Father.

By Baptism, every member of the Church participates in Christ's priesthood. Through, with, and in Him we redeem that original priesthood. We are called a “royal priesthood” (1 Pt 2:9) because it is the role of the Baptized to be priests for the world, to govern the physical, created world in such a way that they bring it into worship of the Creator.

So Saint Paul writes to the Romans, “I appeal to you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship” (Rom 12:1). Notice two aspects of this important verse. First, the physicality: *present your bodies*. Our bodies are incorporated into the worship of God. As Saint Paul says elsewhere, “Glorify God in your body” (1 Cor 6:20). Second, the role of the word. The English refers to “spiritual” worship. The literal rendering of the Greek would be “logical” worship. That is, worship that pertains to the *logos*, the word...and the Word. So, both body and word are involved in the priesthood of the faithful. We labor in the world to bring all things into praise of Him and then give voice to that praise with our words.

Are You Called To Be a Lay Dominican?



Please note that any books placed on the publication racks in the vestibules must be approved by the pastor. Only authorized staff may add books to the rack.

Parish Sacraments

Baptism Classes—Baptisms are held weekly but registration is required through the Rectory office one month in advance. Both parents are required to attend a scheduled instructional session before the baptism. Details will be provided about baptism at that session. Contact Ginny Beauchamp, 703-532-8815/gbeauchamp@stjamescatholic.org, or visit our website, stjamescatholic.org/sacraments/baptism.

Weddings—Contact Susan Ramsel, 703-532-8815/sramsel@stjamescatholic.org, at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. This is an Arlington Diocese requirement. Also, couples wishing to marry will have to schedule a meeting with a parish priest before the church can be reserved.

Funeral Planning—The first step in planning a funeral should be to contact a funeral home. The funeral home will coordinate with the church to plan the date and time and contact the music director. The priest who celebrates the funeral Mass will contact the family to set up a meeting with the family and to discuss details of the Mass.

Anointing of the Sick—Parishioners can request this sacrament of healing for themselves or a loved one by calling the Rectory at 703-532-8815. For an emergency requiring the sacraments of the church outside of office hours, call our office and follow the menu prompts for the priests' emergency line. This sacrament is not limited to those near death and may be received more than once by a person who is ill or suffering.

Mass Intentions Policy

We are blessed to have a large number of people requesting Mass intentions. Unfortunately, because of this, we often have more requests than we can satisfy in a reasonable time (i.e., within one year). We must limit the number of Mass intentions granted to 12 per year per household.

This policy allows us to accommodate more requests. In addition, the "Pro Populo" Mass—the Mass for all parishioners required to be offered every Sunday and Holy Day of obligation—has set times on those days. We appreciate your support.



OVERCOMING SPIRITUAL DISCOURAGEMENT: An Ignatian Path to Hope

All of us experience ups and downs in our daily spiritual life: times when God feels close and we have spiritual energy, and times when that energy wanes, and we struggle with discouragement. In fourteen practical guidelines ("rules"), St. Ignatius of Loyola offers invaluable aid toward understanding this experience, finding freedom from discouragement, and living our daily lives with joy. If this teaching is perennially important, it is more so now in such uncertain times. In this retreat, Fr. Mark Yavarone, OMV, will explore St. Ignatius' teaching and apply it to our experience through concrete examples.

Fr. Yavarone was ordained in 2000 as a member of the Oblates of the Virgin Mary. He has since served as an Associate Pastor at St. Andrew's Parish in Avenel, NJ; a missionary in the Philippines; a member of the faculty at Pope St. John XXIII National Seminary in Weston, MA; and Director of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Retreat Center in Venice, FL. In 2025, he cofounded the Ignatian Discernment Institute with Fr. Timothy Gallagher. His work has appeared in *The Way*, *Linacre Quarterly*, and *Homiletic and Pastoral Review*.



Want To Do More for Love of God and Neighbor?


