





On The Way

Figures of the Resurrection: John

It seems like an unnecessary boast. "They both ran," John the Evangelist tells us of his Easter morning race with Peter. "[B]ut the other disciple [John himself] ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first." Similarly, John tells us that he could see better than Peter. In their encounter with the risen Lord at the Sea of Tiberias, it was John who first recognized Him standing on the shore. "It is the Lord!" he cried. But both boasts pale in comparison to the title John gives himself: "The disciple whom Jesus loved."

That last point is the most important about John. For if Peter represents the virtue of faith, then John represents that of love. Both virtues run to see the empty tomb. Love runs more swiftly. But it still yields to faith, as John awaited Peter at the tomb and didn't enter until he arrived. Faith precedes love insofar as we cannot love what we do not know. Faith makes known to us the true God precisely so that we can love Him. Without faith, we don't know Him and cannot love Him.

At the same time, love itself is a form of knowing. Saint Augustine says, "How senseless, therefore, are they who look for God with bodily eyes, since He is seen by the heart." Or as Pope Benedict puts it, "The organ for seeing God is the heart. The intellect alone is not enough. In order for man to become capable of perceiving God, the energies of his existence have to work in harmony. His will must be pure and so too must the underlying affective dimension of his soul."

The organ for seeing God is the heart. That's bad biology but good theology. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God. For us wayfarers, this means that only the heart that has been purified can see God. A pure heart is singular, whole, and entire. Our failure to know Him comes from our divided hearts, from conflicting desires that blur our vision.

Which brings us back to John's moniker, *the disciple whom Jesus loved*. It might sound haughty and self-centered, but we should hear it as a transparent childlike statement: *I know that I am loved by Jesus*. Because he knew he was loved, John knew how to love in return and was purified. As he himself would write years later, *We love, because he first loved us*.

The disciple whom Jesus loved. Of course, John doesn't intend this title to imply that our Lord didn't love the others. Nor does he necessarily mean that Jesus had a special affection for him. He intends rather to describe what it means to be a beloved disciple. After all, we're all called to be that. Indeed, we are already made beloved disciples...but we need to learn how to live that beloved status. John shows us how.

The disciple whom Jesus loved. John first uses that phrase first at the Last Supper, when he describes how he leaned into Jesus' chest, upon His Sacred Heart. He next uses it to speak of himself standing with the Mother of Jesus at the foot of the Cross. Now, this is what we beloved disciples do. We lean on Christ's chest and rest our heads on His Sacred Heart. Come to me... We stand with His Mother in her suffering and receive her as Christ's gift, taking her into our own.

In short, the gifts of the Eucharist and our Lady teach and reveal who we are: beloved disciples. The more we receive these gifts from Christ, the more we can rejoice in His resurrection, recognize His presence, and run to see Him.

Mother's visit to her cousin Elizabeth and the encounter of Jesus and St. John the Baptist while in the wombs of their mothers.



Memorial Day-Monday, May 26th


On Monday, May 26th, we will observe Memorial Day. The rectory and school offices will be closed. The rectory will also be closed on Saturday, May 24th.

This accomplishment follows years of working on rank advancement which includes completing the 21 Eagle required merit badges, holding a leadership position in the troop, and providing service to the community. The capstone Eagle Projects further contributed to the community with construction of parish garden compost bins, owl nesting, soccer clinic for special needs youth, invasive plant species removal, construction of parish garden shed access, and parish landscaping. This cohort of scouts participated in camping trips around canoeing, hiking, and fishing as well as BSA high adventure camps such as Philmont and Sea Base. These new Eagle Scouts join the over 180 Troop 681 Eagle Scouts since 1952.




Saint James Donut Sunday June 1st
