On The Way

The Apostles: Saint James

Following the Gospels' listing of the Apostles (see Mt 10:2-4), we come now to our parish patron, Saint James. He is also called James *the Greater* to distinguish him from the other James among the Apostles. That moniker indicates that he was either older or taller than the other.

Now, most of what scripture tells us about James is associated with his brother John. The Lord calls them at the same time. "And going on a little farther, he saw James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, who were in their boat mending the nets. And immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired servants, and followed him" (Mk 1:19-20). Those two verses give us a sense of the intensity of James and John. They are strong and determined men who give all and don't settle for half measures. Jesus Himself nicknames them *Boanerges* – *Sons of Thunder* (Mk 3:17). He calls them from their father, but He knows they will be a handful. Indeed, on one occasion He needs to rebuke them when they suggest calling down fire on a town (Lk 9:54-55).

We also know that the mother of James and John was among the women who accompanied our Lord and the Apostles. She is traditionally identified as Mary Salome, one of the women at the foot of the Cross on Good Friday (see Mt 27:56; Mk 15:40) and at the tomb on Easter morning (see Mk 16:1). She is also the one who approaches our Lord and asks, "Command that these two sons of mine may sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your kingdom" (Mt 20:21). Clearly, James and John got their intensity from their mother.

Of course, the sons of Zebedee weren't innocent in their mother's petition (Mark leaves her out of his account entirely). And the exchange is in keeping with what we already know about their character. Jesus responds to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I am to drink?" To which they reply, "We are able." It's a generous, if somewhat naïve, response.

The other Apostles were offended by the affrontery of James and John. And not without reason. But at the same time, there's something good about their petition. Jesus isn't upset and doesn't scold them for their audacity. Perhaps He even smiled at their bravado and swagger, seeing an ambition and energy that He could work with.

There's an old saying, "You can't push a rope." You can't work with someone who has no will or backbone. James was not a rope. He had the strong raw material in his soul for our Lord's grace to work with. Jesus can do very little with pusillanimity and weakness of will. But He can work with ambition – purifying and shaping it into magnanimity, that greatness of soul that seeks spiritual heights.

James (and John and Peter) had just that kind of holy ambition able to be purified by our Lord. Perhaps this is why Jesus makes him not just an Apostle but part of His innermost circle. Together with Peter and John, he is present at privileged moments in Jesus' ministry that seem designed to harness his zeal: the healing of the daughter of Jairus (Lk 8:41-56), the Transfiguration (Lk 9:28:36), and the agony in the garden (Mk 14:32-33). At the healing, he learns from the Lord's mercy that power is ordered towards helping others. At the Transfiguration, he learns from the Lord's prayer and glorification that greatness is union with the Father. In Gethsemane he learns from His sacrifice to seek the Father's will and give one's life for others.

Abortion Amendment to the Virginia Constitution—On Thursday, January 15th, 500 Pro-life advocates from all over the state came to Richmond to express opposition to the radical pro-abortion amendment, officially titled the “Virginia Right to Reproductive Freedom Amendment.” Sadly, the House of Delegates and the Senate approved this abortion amendment along party lines.



This abortion amendment will go directly to Virginia voters on a ballot initiative in November 2026. Each VA voter will be able to support or oppose this amendment. **This proposed amendment is in opposition to our Catholic faith which calls us to respect the dignity of all human life from conception to natural death.** Passage of this amendment will permanently enshrine abortion rights in our Virginia Constitution. More to come on this ballot issue in the coming weeks.

Falls Church City Sidewalk Widening Plan— March 2026

As part of its West Broad Street Multimodal Improvements project and overall vision of a more walkable city, the City of Falls Church plans to widen the sidewalks on our side of Broad Street from Virginia Avenue to West Street. Below are some facts and impacts of the sidewalk widening.

- Generally, the sidewalks will be widened from 5-feet to 10-feet, with some exceptions.
- The City is compensating Saint James for taking a strip of our land for the sidewalk widening in front of our Guest House, Teachers' Lot, School, Convent, and Rocket Field.
 - ⇒ To make room for the wider sidewalk, some structures on our property will need to be relocated permanently, including the Teachers' Lot fence, the School LED sign (possibly), and the stone wall in front of the Convent.
 - ⇒ These displacements have been factored into the compensation which the City is providing to Saint James.
- The streets involved will include
 - ⇒ Virginia Avenue
 - ⇒ Lee Street
 - ⇒ Oak Street
 - ⇒ Spring Street
 - ⇒ West Street

Construction is likely to take at least two years and might begin as early as the second half of 2026. In an effort to minimize disruptions to the Saint James campus, the parish remains in ongoing communication with the City of Falls Church regarding the construction timeline and other project details that may affect our community. We will share updates as they become available in the bulletin as well as on the parish and school websites.

A Sad Bulletin Change

Many of you are aware that parish bulletins have become fodder for scammers. Because they are posted online, they can be mined for information that can be misused. In fact, you might be one of the lucky parishioners who's received an email or text supposedly from me but really from modern day swindlers. Which is all to say that we have to be more circumspect and prudent about what we put in the bulletin.

This sad truth has an immediate impact on an important aspect of our bulletin. For years we've listed members of the military from our parish in the bulletin – to honor their service and ask for prayers. Unfortunately, we can no longer do so. This decision comes from information I received about the military's own operational security requirements for those who are serving. Dropping this information from the bulletin serves three important ends: first, to protect our family and friends who support national security missions; second, to protect the families of those serving; lastly, to promote the safety of the parish.

I encourage all parishioners to pray for peace, for those members of our parish who have taken the oath to defend our nation, and especially for those currently in harm's way. While we will not publicly name our parish's military and foreign service personnel, we will continue the bulletin's regular reminder to pray for them.
