



#### On The Way

Saint Augustine: Faith and Reason

One of the great modern objections to faith is the perceived opposition to science. This is part of the broader conflict that many see between faith and reason (which we confine to science). This is so characteristic of our modern techno-industrial world that we might think it's exclusive to it. In fact, Saint Augustine also struggled to understand the relationship of faith and reason.

We see this in his intellectual journey from Manichaeism to philosophy to neo-platonic philosophy and finally to Christianity. It was shaped by the desire to live both faith and reason. He initially dismissed Christian scriptures (particularly the Old Testament) as too rough and anti-intellectual. He eventually soured on the Manichees because they couldn't satisfactorily answer his questions.

More than anyone else, Saint Ambrose brought faith and reason into harmony for Augustine. In him Augustine found a man he could respect for his eloquence and teaching but who was also pious and faithful. Ambrose's regard for Augustine's mother made an impression: "[H]e would often, when he saw me, burst forth into her praises, congratulating me that I had such a mother." That someone as learned as Ambrose could appreciate Monica's piety indicated that faith and reason were not opposed.

Years later Augustine would address this issue with his faithful, always wanting them to have a reasonable faith and faithful reason. In one sermon, he takes up and in effect settles this issue with two pithy phrases: *Crede ut intelliges; Intellige ut credas* – Believe so that you can understand; Understand so that you can believe.

First: Crede ut intelleges – Believe, so that you can understand. Faith is a participation in the knowledge of another. When we deem a person to be trustworthy and take him at his word, then we grow in knowledge and the capacity to reason. Such trust in another is called natural faith and we exercise it all the time.

A student must have natural faith in order to reason. Johnny learns to read and write because he trusts his teacher, not because he's proven everything himself. If he doubts his teacher ("Hey, are those *really* the ABCs? Prove it!"), then he will never learn to read and write. Students of science don't insist on proving the great discoveries of the past all over again. They have faith in their teachers and trust that what is being handed down is true. That kind of faith doesn't stunt their reason but enables it. When a student lacks natural faith and insists that everything be proven to his satisfaction, then he cripples his ability to know and to reason.

By *supernatural* faith we accept as true what *God* has revealed. When we believe in Him, we participate in His knowledge. We know Him and His works and then, by applying our reason, we can appreciate and understand them more. The refusal to believe, on the other hand, means that His truths remain closed off to us. Our human reason is crippled, confined to this world alone.

Then there's the second part: *Intellige ut credas – Understand so that you can believe*. Theology is defined as "Faith seeking understanding." Not all of us should be theologians, but we should seek to understand our faith as we are able. When we apply our human reason to the content of our faith, then we come to appreciate its beauty, structure, and reasonableness. We see the interrelation of various teachings and become better at applying them to worship and to our daily life. We thus grow in our faith, our ability to trust. Failure to do so imperils our faith, as our Lord warns us: "The seed sown on the path is the one who hears the word of the kingdom without understanding it, and the evil one comes and steals away what was sown in his heart" (Mt 12:19).

# The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day Mass)

This year All Souls' Day falls on Sunday, November 2nd. All Masses that weekend will commemorate the faithful departed.

We will honor those who have died since November 2024 with a special insert in the bulletin that weekend.

We will include those who had funeral Masses and memorials here at Saint James as well as the names that were submitted to us the past couple of weeks.

#### **World Mission Sunday Second Collection**

This weekend, **October 18-19**, our second collection will be for World Mission Sunday. In 1926 Pope Pius XI instituted Mission Sunday for the whole Church with the first worldwide Mission Sunday collection taking place in October 1927.

Mission Sunday is celebrated in all the local Churches as the feast of catholicity and universal

#### **Improving the Safety of our IHM Sisters**

We are in the final planning phase for installation of a new fire alarm system in our Convent on Spring Street.

The now \$250,000 (originally \$135,000) project has already had to negotiate a number of hurdles. The latest hurdle was the discovery of asbestos on all four floors of the Convent. Rather than attempt to contain and work around the asbestos, we have decided to remove it altogether, thus adding another safety benefit to the project.

This means, however, that the Sisters might have to relocate temporarily while the work is being performed.

Please pray for our IHM Sisters as they deal with the inconvenience and disruption of asbestos removal and construction activity in their home.

Saint James' Social Outreach Committee provides support for the winter hypothermia Falls Church Homeless Shelter located at 217 Gordon Road in Falls Church. The shelter's mission is to provide shelter, food, and counseling services for 12 adults in need during the winter season. This year, the shelter will open on November 15, 2025, through March 31, 2026. Members of our parish serve on the board and volunteer their time to help the shelter.

How can you support the shelter? In addition to monetary support, parishioners can donate food, personal hygiene items, paper supplies, meals, and their time to work with our residents. Our website, <a href="https://www.fcshelter.org">www.fcshelter.org</a>, provides all the information regarding volunteer work and how to sign up for the different opportunities. As in previous years, you have the option to donate your time and spend an evening at the shelter. Volunteers are needed from Thursday to Sunday evenings from 5:30pm to midnight, and will be working hand in hand with the residents and professional staff. Training is provided for those who volunteer.

The website also provides the opportunity to go to the Falls Church Homeless Shelter Amazon Wish list and order items to be delivered directly to the shelter. Church ministries that want to help the shelter are welcome to show their support through volunteer work to prepare for this year's open season or to share time with our residents by doing crafts, playing cards, and other activities.
