



On The Way

Redeeming Word and Body: God's Communication

We have two principal ways of communicating with one another. I don't mean the mere imparting of data, facts, statistics, etc. It's increasingly clear that you don't need to be human to do that. No, I mean the communication of our thoughts, ideas, feelings, etc. The communication of our very *selves*.

First, and most obviously, we communicate by our words – in poetry, prose, songs, letters, notes, etc. Second, by our bodies – in our expressions, gestures, postures, paintings, sculptures, dance, etc. These two modes of communication are intimately connected. Indeed, they should be one organic whole. So, we ask people if they can "see" what we're saying, as if our words could take shape and become visible, like a body. We say that someone can "paint a picture" with his words. We refer to "body language," acknowledging that we communicate physically every bit as much as, if not more than, we do verbally.

It's worth reflecting on these means of communication – word and body – because they are central to who we are. They are intrinsic to our nature as those created in the image and after the likeness of God, but also as fallen and redeemed creatures. The whole arc of salvation history can be understood through this lens of word and body. And since these are not incidental to our everyday lives, it's good for us to appreciate their role in who we are, how we've fallen, and how we are redeemed.

We communicate in this way because God did so first. We who are created in His image, after His likeness, simply follow His example. We image Him. He created the world "to show forth and communicate his glory" (CCC 319). Although He completely transcends the world, He has created it to manifest His glory and to be a place where His creatures can share in his truth, goodness and beauty (see CCC 319). He created the world to communicate Himself and to commune with His creatures.

In His act of creation, there is a profound union of word and body. He speaks a word – "Let there be light...Let the earth bring forth vegetation...Let the earth bring forth living creatures" (Gen 1:3,11, 24) – and a physical thing comes into being. By His words He speaks into being the physical, bodily world.

In turn, that bodily world speaks of Him. "The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims his handiwork. Day to day pours forth speech, and night to night declares knowledge. There is no speech, nor are there words; their voice is not heard; yet their voice goes out through all the earth, and their words to the end of the world" (Ps 19:1-4). "Ever since the creation of the world his invisible nature, namely, his eternal power and deity, has been clearly perceived in the things that have been made" (Rom 1:20).

He manifests Himself in the world most of all by the one He creates in His image and after His likeness. He speaks man into existence: "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness" (Gen 1:26). This image and likeness has a body: "[T]he LORD God formed man of dust from the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living being" (Gen 2:7).

God began creation, began to reveal Himself, by word and body. And most of all in the creation of man as His own image and likeness. The revelation of God that began then is later fulfilled in the same way, but also in a manner never imagined: "And *the Word became flesh* and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father" (Jn 1:14).

Father Tim Banach will be our guest speaker. We will also have a sing-a-long accompanied by Ricki Krivijanski on piano and a trivia game.



Support Falls Church Homeless Shelter

Saint James' Social Outreach Committee provides support for the winter hypothermia Falls Church Homeless Shelter located at 217 Gordon Road in Falls Church. The shelter's mission is to provide shelter, food, and counseling services for 12 adults in need during the winter season. This year, the shelter will open on November 15, 2025, through March 31, 2026. Members of our parish serve on the board and volunteer their time to help the shelter.

How can you support the shelter? In addition to monetary support, parishioners can donate food, personal hygiene items, paper supplies, meals, and their time to work with our residents. Our website, www.fcshelter.org, provides all the information regarding volunteer work and how to sign up for the different opportunities. As in previous years, you have the option to donate your time and spend an evening at the shelter. Volunteers are needed from Thursday to Sunday evenings from 5:30pm to midnight, and will be working hand in hand with the residents and professional staff. Training is provided for those who volunteer.

The website also provides the opportunity to go to the Falls Church Homeless Shelter Amazon Wish list and order items to be delivered directly to the shelter. Church ministries that want to help the shelter are welcome to show their support through volunteer work to prepare for this year's open season or to share time with our residents by doing crafts, playing cards, and other activities.

Families Helping Families





Diocesan Vocational Program Survey

In November 2022, Bishop Burbidge presented 23 strategic initiatives to the People of God in the Diocese of Arlington. Among those 23 initiatives was one exploring the interest of a Catholic-based Vocational Program in the diocese. Recently, the diocese completed a first survey, and in that survey over 92% of respondents enthusiastically supported such a program.

This overwhelming response prompts the effort to advance to the next step: to survey for preferences on the model (or kind) of school and the location of that school. This is a momentous idea, and <u>parishioners are asked to take the survey out of personal interest or for the good of the diocese</u>.
