



On The Way

The Theological Virtues in Christ's Resurrection

Can God be trusted? That question haunts the human heart. Many don't believe precisely because they don't think He can be trusted and don't want to hand over control to Him. Even those who believe are constantly renewing their surrender and abandonment to Him

In a sense, Christ Himself provokes this question. As we heard last Sunday, on the Cross He prayed, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit" (Lk 23:46). It is a prayer awaiting an answer. Does the Father hear? Will He answer? Can He be trusted? Does it make sense to depend on Him, to commend oneself to Him? By extension, this prompts questions about Christ Himself. Can we trust His teachings and His promises? Is it foolish to love one's enemies? Put simply, are we foolish to believe, to hope, and to love?

The Resurrection of Jesus Christ gives the answers to these questions. Indeed, Christ risen from the dead *is* the Father's answer. The Resurrection proclaims that the Father can be trusted; that it makes sense to commend oneself, as Jesus did, into His hands. In short, the risen Christ proclaims the power of faith, hope, and charity. By raising His Son from the dead, the Father responds, *Yes* to our questions. To believe in Him, to hope in Him, and to love Him brings not just life but life triumphant over death – eternal life.

Faith. It is an article of faith that Jesus Christ rose from the dead in His human body. Indeed, this article of faith gives proof to all the others because it reveals Christ's authority – that He is worthy of our faith. Early in His ministry He established the Resurrection as the proof of His authority. When He drove the moneychangers from the Temple, the Jews asked for a sign of His authority to do so. "Destroy this temple," He said about His body, "and in three days I will raise it up" (Jn 2:19).

Thus, the resurrection vindicates all he said and did. Because He is raised, we have faith in all He taught – about Baptism, the Eucharist, the Church, marriage, serving the poor, loving one's enemies, and so on. These are trustworthy only because the risen One teaches them. What we believe brings life even to those in death.

Hope. Because He has triumphed over death, we can hope in Him in every situation. His resurrection reveals the impotence of all worldly powers. We should not hope in them. No amount of money or force of arms could raise Him. Only the Father in Whom He trusted could do that. Thus, Jesus shows us the path of hope, to commend everything into the Father's hands. Further, Jesus is the pattern of our hope. We hope that we will be raised like Him, body and soul, to the glory of heaven. Indeed, in hope we anticipate that dwelling already: "If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth" (Col 3:1-2).

Charity. To will the good of the other requires faith and hope. We need knowledge of Christ's authoritative words and example of charity; we need confidence in His promises. Christ on the Cross exemplifies love of God and neighbor. There He offers His life to the Father out of obedience and love; there He offers His life for our sake. In the Resurrection He reveals that such love is not useless or vain. His triumph over death proclaims that the love of God truly conquers all.

May the risen Christ breathe into your souls a renewed and deepened faith, hope, and love!

How to Receive the Graces of Divine Mercy Sunday

To receive these graces, the only condition is to receive Holy Communion worthily on Divine Mercy Sunday (or the Vigil celebration) by making a good confession beforehand and staying in the state of grace and trusting in His Divine Mercy.

By these conditions, our Lord is emphasizing the value of confession and Holy Communion as miracles of mercy. The Eucharist is Jesus, Himself, the Living God, longing to pour Himself as Mercy into our hearts.

In addition, if we want to receive mercy we must be merciful. Our Lord told St. Faustina:

"Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be acts of mercy" (742).


