#### On The Wav

Catechesis on the Eucharist: Elijah's Bread

In the life of the prophet Elijah, there are two events that prefigure and teach us about the Eucharist. The first (1 Kgs 17) comes early in his ministry, after he announces the drought to come upon Israel for its apostasy. Elijah stood before King Ahab and proclaimed, "As the LORD the God of Israel lives, before whom I stand, there shall be neither dew nor rain these years, except by my word."

Of course, he himself was not exempt from the drought. He suffered with the people. But the Lord provided for him miraculously. He instructed him to go to a brook, where "the ravens brought him bread and meat in the morning, and bread and meat in the evening; and he drank from the brook." If this sounds familiar to you, that's because it should. Elijah is reliving, re-presenting the experience of the Israelites in the Exodus. As he did for them, so now God provides water, meat, and bread miraculously for Elijah.

Central to this is the bread. It is bread that he cannot provide for himself. Bread that comes from God. Bread that nourishes him even in the midst of a sinful people. All of which sheds light on what the Eucharist is for us. It's not our own creation but God's gift. It's our superabundant nourishment as we dwell in a region of spiritual desolation and drought.

Elijah's second "eucharistic" moment (1 Kgs 19) comes after his confrontation with the priests of Baal, men who lead the people into infant sacrifice. Jezebel their patroness was understandably upset by Elijah's defeat and execution of her personal prophets. She pledged to execute Elijah as he had executed them. Elijah fled for his life, but in the course of his journey the Lord intervened to make it not just a flight but a pilgrimage.

Elijah travelled for one day into the wilderness and gave himself up for dead. "And he lay down and slept under a broom tree; and behold, an angel touched him, and said to him, 'Arise and eat.' And he looked, and behold, there was at his head a cake baked on hot stones and a jar of water." He returned to sleep and was again roused by the angel: "Arise and eat, else the journey will be too great for you.' And he arose, and ate and drank, and went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God."

Again, this should sound familiar. Elijah is re-presenting the Exodus. As Moses led the Israelites into the wilderness to escape Pharaoh, so now Elijah, representing all of Israel, goes into the wilderness to flee Jezebel, the new persecutor of God's people. And he comes to the same mountain as Moses, for "Horeb" is another name for *Sinai*, where Israel's covenant with the Lord was first established. Elijah is returning to Israel's roots, renewing their union with the Lord. And the food that enables him to do this is that bread provided by an angel. What was said of the Israelites can likewise be applied to Elijah: "Man ate of the bread of the angels" (Ps 78:25).

Just as Elijah's bread brought him back to Mount Sinai, to the source of the covenant between the Lord and Israel, so our reception of Holy Communion brings us into contact with and indeed incorporates us into the Sacrifice of the New Covenant. Elijah's bread brought him to Mount Sinai. Our reception of the Eucharist brings us to Calvary and unites us with Christ in the sacrifice of the new and eternal covenant.



#### **Voter Information for the November Election**

Election day in Virginia is **Tuesday, November 7th**. Every seat in the General Assembly (100 delegates and 40 senators) is up for election. The newly drawn district lines will take effect, which means that many will be voting in new districts in Virginia. These changes present both challenges and

opportunities for us to exercise our duty and right to vote. To help Catholics learn about



what to expect in this critical off-year election, our diocesan Office for Marriage, Family, and Respect Life and The National Committee for A Human Life Amendment (HLA) have set up various information sessions on how the legislative process in Virginia works, how to find new districts and representatives, and how to maximize voter turnout in the Commonwealth. 



### **IHM Centennial Celebration**


This year marks the centennial of the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (IHM) at Saint James Catholic School. On **September 17, 1923**, under the leadership of Mother Josepha Clarke, the IHM Sisters began teaching 92 students at Saint James School. In addition to running our parish school, the IHM Sisters also spread the Catholic faith by catechizing the children from several parishes and mission churches in Northern Virginia.

To commemorate this historic event, Bishop Michael Burbidge will celebrate the Noon Mass for the intentions of the IHM Sisters. We invite you to join us at the Noon Mass on September 17th, 2023-100 years to the day from when the IHM Sisters began teaching our students--to celebrate this important milestone. A reception for the IHM Sisters will take place immediately following Mass from 1:00pm-3:00pm in Knecht gym.

Several IHM sisters who were missioned here at Saint James will be attending the event, including Sister Marie Jeannine Dawson, who was our first IHM vocation. Sister Jeannine entered the IHM Order on October 2, 1948, the Feast of the Guardian Angels, which was also her 20th birthday. She is 94 years young and is looking forward to joining us for the celebration on September 17th!




