



On The Way

Catechesis on the Eucharist: The Bread of Life Discourse, 3

In his teaching, it wasn't uncommon for our Lord to meet with confusion in his listeners. After all, he used human words to convey divine truths. It was reasonable that they would need some explaining. When he taught Nicodemus about the necessity of Baptism (Jn 3), that scholar didn't grasp what it meant to be "born anew." He asked Jesus, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" So, our Lord patiently explained the metaphor and the meaning of *spiritual* rebirth. Nicodemus was taking him too literally.

Likewise, the Samaritan woman at the well (Jn 4) didn't understand his reference to "living water." She responded, "Sir, you have nothing to draw with, and the well is deep; where do you get that living water?" Again, Jesus patiently explained the metaphor, that she was taking his words too literally, and that this water was the Holy Spirit.

So when the crowds in Capernaum (Jn 6) take issue with Jesus' words, we should fully expect that, as before, he would clarify what he meant and show where they had misunderstood him. Based on the previous two events, it would be reasonable to presume an explanation of how they were interpreting him too literally. Like "born anew" and "living water," the phrase "I am the bread of life" should be understood as a metaphor for a spiritual reality.

But he doesn't. One of the most distinct and shocking elements of the Bread of Life Discourse is our Lord's repeated insistence that the literal, physical interpretation is the correct one. This is no mere metaphor. Three different times, the crowds take issue with what he says. Each time he confirms what he had said previously. He "doubles down," as we might say. Technically, he "triples down."

First, the Jews "murmured at him, because he said, 'I am the bread which came down from heaven." Our Lord responds strongly, "Do not murmur among yourselves..." and then proceeds to strengthen what he had just said: proclaiming not only "I am the bread come down from heaven" but now something even stronger, "I am the bread of life...I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh."

The Jews again respond with incredulity: "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" To which our Lord answers even more strongly and with a solemn introduction: "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you...For my flesh is food indeed, and my blood is drink indeed. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him."

Because of this, some disciples conclude that they can no longer follow him. They ask, "This is a hard saying; who can listen to it?" To which our Lord still doesn't respond with a concession or a metaphorical explanation. He allows them to depart. "After this many of his disciples drew back and no longer went about with him." May we not be those who draw back and are lost. May we make our own Saint Peter response to this teaching: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life; and we have believed, and have come to know, that you are the Holy One of God."





From Satanist to Apostle of the Rosary

With St. Therese of Lisieux and St. Teresa of Avila, Carmelites can seem to "own" the month of October. But there's a wowzah of a Lay Dominican to celebrate, too. Blessed Bartolo Longo (1841-1926) was raised Catholic, lost his faith in college, was "ordained" a Satanist "priest," and was brought back to the Faith by a Dominican who gave Bartolo a wake-up call and guided him to devotion to the Rosary. Bartolo went on to raise a shrine (now Basilica) to Our Lady in Pompeii. At Bartolo's 1980 beatification, Pope St. John Paul II dubbed him "Apostle of the Rosary." Blessed Bartolo shows that no matter how deeply a soul may be mired in sin and error, there is hope in the inexhaustible mercy of God.


