On The Way

Catechesis on the Eucharist: The Real Presence

Saint Paul concludes his narrative of the Institution of the Eucharist with this powerful description of the liturgy: "For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes." Contained in this statement is the understanding that Jesus Christ is truly present in the bread and wine. For if they were just symbols, the celebration couldn't possibly carry that kind of proclamation. It is because Christ is truly, substantially present under the form of bread and wine that the celebration of the Eucharist is also the making present of his Sacrifice.

The Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist that Saint Paul teaches here has become a distinctly Catholic doctrine. Although clearly the understanding of the early Church, it is now absent in Protestant worship and teaching. But what precisely is it that the Church believes? What do we mean by "Real Presence"? If he's really present in the Eucharist...does that mean that he's not present elsewhere? No, because God is omnipresent. Nothing would exist if God did not sustain all things in being by his presence as Creator. There's nowhere we can go where God is not. So...how is the Eucharist different?

Maybe an analogy to Christmas will help. On that day, at the moment of Christ's birth, God was spiritually present everywhere throughout the world. But at that moment he was also present in a unique way in Bethlehem. There, lying in a manger, he was not only spiritually present but also physically present by way of his human body. Our Lady, Joseph, and the shepherds didn't encounter him just spiritually but physically. This is the great mystery we celebrate, that God is with us in a new and unique mode.

So, if you were alive on that first Christmas, you wouldn't have shrugged and thought, "Well, after all, God is everywhere." No, you would have, like the Magi, hastened to Bethlehem so that you could look upon and touch God present in that specific place.

Now, we should think of the Eucharist as the extension of the Incarnation. It continues to make him present not just spiritually but also bodily. You can encounter God spiritually wherever you go. In fact, you *should*. You should often remind yourself of his presence. You should make a spiritual communion by lifting your heart and mind to him and likewise inviting him into your soul. That he is spiritually omnipresent means that we can always be with him.

But in the Eucharist we have the added reality of Christmas. The omnipresent God is uniquely present in a specific place that we can go and visit. In the Eucharist, we encounter Jesus Christ more than just spiritually. His Eucharistic presence is what the Church calls real and substantial: his Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity.

Beginning with Saint Paul's account, the Church has always taught this. Not long after Paul, Saint Ignatius of Antioch, in his Letter to the Smyrnaeans in the year 110 A.D. laments those who "not confess that the Eucharist is the flesh of our Savior Jesus Christ, flesh which suffered for our sins and which that Father, in his goodness, raised up again." In about 189 A.D., Saint Irenaeus (a disciple of Ignatius) argued for Christ's divinity from what he clearly regards as the common Christian belief: "If the Lord were from other than the Father, how could he rightly take bread, which is of the same creation as our own, and confess it to be his body and affirm that the mixture in the cup is his blood?"


