



On The Way

Redeeming Word and Body: Our Redeeming Body

The flesh, Tertullian says, is the "hinge of salvation." Christ redeemed us by way of His Body. He continues this work, sanctifying us by nourishing us with His Body in the Eucharist and incorporating us into His Body, the Church. These works of His call for our response and participation. The human body is not only redeemed but redeeming; not only restored to God but a participant in our sanctification. Not only is the human body sanctified by God's assuming it to himself, but it is also the means by which we cooperate in our own sanctification.

This occurs primarily in our reception of the Sacraments. Pope Saint Leo the Great says, "What was visible in our Savior has passed over into his sacraments." Christ's physical, tangible presence that brought sight to the blind, wholeness to lepers, and life to the dead continues in the sacraments of the Church. A sacrament is an "outward sign," something seen, heard, smelled, felt, or tasted. That is, something received by way of the body. It is by way of the sacrament's contact with your body – water poured over the head; the Bread of the Eucharist placed on your tongue that Christ sanctifies your soul.

This gift of grace by way of the body calls for a corresponding response. As He has communicated His grace to our souls by way of our bodies, so we respond to that grace by our bodies. As His Body was the instrument of redemption, so our bodies are the instruments of sanctification and salvation. "So glorify God in your body" (1 Cor 6:20).

This is why we involve the body so much in our prayer and worship. Standing, kneeling, bowing, genuflecting, even just sitting in a posture of reverence – it's the entire person who prays. Just as "body language" in other contexts might help or hurt a relationship, so in our conversation with God the body matters. Prayer is the lifting of the heart and mind to God, but it's also the body giving expressing to it and cultivating that interior disposition. The Sign of the Cross, for example, is a pray in and of itself. By way of it, we confess the Triune God and the Crucifixion by way of our bodies.

The redeemed and redeeming body is also the reason for the Church's sacred art. That kind of beauty is not a luxury for the few but the patrimony of all Catholics. We need physical beauty to teach us about God's eternal beauty. Sacred art (from the most sublime to the most modest) is both a manifestation of our interior devotion and an aid to it. Further, it is a way by which we extend the redemption of our bodies into the broader physical world, bringing the beauty of Christ's risen Body to others.

A counterintuitive but profoundly important aspect of our redeeming bodies is the ability to offer even our physical suffering. Indeed, suffering is a kind of theological stress test of the body's meaning. Elements of the body's meanings can be found in other religions. Pagans both old and new have a sacramental sense, an awareness of the body's role in worship. The aesthetic knows that art is important for the soul. But only the Christian knows of the body's ability especially in its suffering to participate in Christ's act of redemption.

The body participates in Christ's redemption not only when we are healthy and beautiful but also - and more so - when we are united with Him in our suffering. Saint Paul captures the redemptive power of the body in his famous words to the Colossians: "[I]n my flesh I complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church" (Col 1:24).



inscription of the **new year** separated by the letters.

C, M, and B—i.e., 20+C+M+B+26.

C+M+B stands for the Latin words Christus Mansionem Benedictat, which means "May Christ bless this house."

The letters can also stand for the traditional names of the Magi who visited Christ: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar.

Inclement Weather Policy

Mass takes place as scheduled regardless of the weather. Use your best judgement in severe weather conditions when main roads and neighborhoods may not be safe to drive or walk. Remember on Sundays we livestream the 10:30am English Mass and 2:30pm Spanish Mass on our Facebook page and our website.

Park Avenue is an emergency snow route. Please use our lots (A Lot, B Lot, C Lot, and the Parish House parking lot) and avoid parking there during a snow emergency. Details about snow emergency policy are available on the Falls Church City website.

During inclement weather, our rectory office follows the Falls Church City Government. If the city government is closed or operating on a delay, our rectory will follow the same schedule. The city communicates during emergencies via several outlets, including local news media as well as the city's website and social media platforms.





IRA QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is an opportunity to make a gift from your traditional Individual Retirement Account (IRA). The QCD limit for 2025 is \$108,000 per individual.

Avoid paying Income Tax

Beginning at age 70 ½, IRA owners can make an impact on the parish and at the same time reap significant tax benefits. Using your IRA can be tax advantageous because gifts from your IRA directly to a charity are not subject to ordinary income tax.

Satisfy your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)

Beginning at age 73, IRA owners are typically subject to a taxable Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). Funds you transfer to the parish with a Qualified Charitable Distribution can help satisfy your RMD but are not counted as taxable income.

Your IRA distribution must

To avoid paying income taxes, the distribution must come from the administrator to the parish. You cannot receive the funds first.

Example:

Assume you are 73 years of age or older and your required minimum distribution for the year, which you are required to take by December 31, is \$25,000.

You make a \$15,000 Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) to the parish, designating \$10,000 to support the parish offertory and \$5,000 for the school, maintenance, or another ministry of your choice. Additional Qualified Charitable Distributions could be made to the Diocese of Arlington for the Bishop's Lenten Appeal, or to other charities you support.

The QCD satisfies your \$25,000 Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for the year.

While the \$25,000 distribution is generally not tax deductible, your tax benefit comes from excluding the \$25,000 from your annual gross income.
