



On The Way

Saint Augustine: Conversion

Augustine was 30 years old when he moved to Milan to take up a position as professor of rhetoric. There were two important figures in that city that would play a role in his conversion.

First, Monica, his mother, who had traveled to Milan to be with her son and (she hoped) to arrange a respectable marriage for him. Monica's devotion to her son is legendary and a great consolation to mothers of wayward children. Augustine's father had become Catholic shortly before his death. That conversion was surely the result of Monica's prayer and example. It also seems to have softened Augustine to her pleading. When still back in Africa she had implored (to put in lightly) the local bishop to *do something* about her son. The bishop responded, perhaps out of exhaustion, "Certainly the son of so many tears will not perish." Now in Milan, it was the bishop Ambrose to whom she turned for help.

Ambrose was one of the most well-respected men at that time, both in and outside of the Church. His entrance into Augustine's life is conspicuously providential. Ambrose was an expert in Augustine's own trade of rhetoric, as well as a deeply intelligent man. Impressed by these natural gifts, Augustine was forced to reconsider his prejudice against Christianity. Further, since Augustine's father had died, Ambrose filled a fatherly role. "That man of God received me as a father, and as a bishop welcomed my coming. I came to love him, not at first as a teacher of the truth, which I had utterly despaired of finding in [the] Church, but for his kindness to me."

It was Ambrose's teaching that ultimately undid the harm done to his mind by the Manichees. "I heard him every Sunday preaching the word of truth to his congregation; and I became more and more certain that all those knots of cunning and calumny, which those who deceived me had tangled up against the holy books, could be untangled."

Still, despite the prayers and good example of Monica and Ambrose, Augustine was stuck, unable to break free of his attachments, especially to those of the flesh. He both wanted to become Christian...and couldn't bring himself to do it. The climactic moment in his conversion occurred when, overcome by this interior division, he went into the garden of his residence and threw himself on the ground in tears. He then heard a child singing the words *Take up and read*; take up and read!

Stirred by these words, he immediately picked up the scriptures and, opening at random, fell upon Saint Paul's words: "[N]ot in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires" (Rom 13:13-14). It was the message he needed. "I had no wish to read further, and no need. For in that instant, with the very ending of the sentence, it was as though a light of utter confidence shone in all my heart, and all the darkness of uncertainty vanished away."

Saint Ambrose personally prepared him for initiation and received him into the Church. The next year, Augustine and Monica left Milan. Unfortunately, she died in Ostia as they awaited passage from Italy to Africa. She passed away as one who had been faithful to her Christian duty, who had run the race and kept the faith. But also, as one who (unlike so many other saints) saw the fruit of her prayers and sacrifices. Shortly before dying, she confided to her son, "One thing there was, for which I desired to remain still a little longer in this life, that I should see you a Catholic Christian before I died. This God has granted me in superabundance."

Calling All Moms of Babies and Toddlers


A reminder for current moms, as well as new moms to the parish, join our Moms Meet Up group to connect with other parish moms (with babies and toddlers in tow).

Religious Freedom Week 2025 — Witnesses to Hope

Religious freedom allows the church, and all religious communities, to live out their faith in public and to serve the good of all.

Religious Freedom Week (June 22-June 29) encourages all Catholics to *pray, reflect, and act* to promote religious freedom. The week will begin with the Memorial of Saints John Fisher and Thomas More and end with the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. Below are the daily prayers for the week.



Visit www.usccb.org/committees/religious-liberty/religious-freedom-week to see how you can reflect and act for religious freedom each day. This information will be posted on our homepage and on social media.

- **June 22—Political Polarization—**Pray that Catholics will have the courage to put the truth of the gospel and fidelity to the Church above partisan politics.
- **June 23—IVF Mandates—**Pray for couples who suffer fertility challenges and that political leaders would promote therapies that respect the dignity of all human persons.
- **June 24—Catholic Healthcare**—Pray that governments will respect the consciences of all people who care for the sick and vulnerable.
- **June 25**—**Nicaragua**—Pray for Christians in Nicaragua, where the Catholic Church faces brutal government persecution.
- **June 26—Parental Choice in Education—**Pray that governments would strengthen the ability for parents to direct the education of their children.
- **June 27—Immigration Services—**Pray that the Lord would protect vulnerable migrants and refugees and that the Church enjoy the freedom to carry out the ministries that Christ has handed to her.
- **June 28—Freedom to Serve the Common Good—**Pray that government leaders would recognize the contributions that religious charities make to the common good.
- June 29—Nigeria—Pray for our brothers and sisters in Nigeria who are suffering violent religious conflict.

Summer Reminders

Now that summer is here and family schedules change due to vacations and school being out, remember that "Just as your vacation takes planning and discipline to make happen, so also we must keep certain disciplines in our leisure so that we maintain our identity as children of God."

Below are some ways to maintain your identity as a child of God.

- Mass. In your travels, make sure you plan ahead so that you can make it to Mass every Sunday, wherever your travels take you. - Confession. Go to confession monthly...take your children...and then take them out afterward for dinner or dessert. Just as the 40 days of Lent lead into the 50 days of Easter, so our repentance should always lead to rejoicing!
- **Rosary**. At some point this summer, you will find yourself on a flight or long drive. Plenty of time to pray the Rosary! In fact, the time between when you take your seat on a plane and take off is about the time it takes to pray a Rosary. So, make sure you have your Rosary with you, in your pocket or in your purse, so that you can give that time of prayer to God whenever the opportunity pops up.
