





On The Way

The Theological Virtues: Loving God in our Neighbor

Our Lord's command to "love your neighbor as yourself" isn't new. He's simply quoting Leviticus 19:18. What's new is that Jesus pairs love of neighbor with love of God. Remember, He's asked to name just one — the greatest — commandment. But he gives the two great commandments, love of God and love of neighbor. With love of self dropped in between them. The clear teaching is that these loves are really one. And that is a new teaching.

Now, there's always the temptation to separate love of God and love of neighbor. On one hand, some people seek to love and glorify God...but to the neglect of their neighbors and sometimes even their own family members. They do devout and faithful things. They worship properly and know the liturgy well and know the feasts and the saints and so on. But they are failing to love God properly by not loving their neighbor. Authentic love of God inevitably extends to one's neighbor. Our worship is not authentic if it does not result in a greater love of neighbor.

On the other hand, some people seek to love others...but without loving God or, more likely, not loving Him first and above all others. This is a form of idolatry, because we have placed someone ahead of God. It becomes pure activism and, eventually, a damaging kind of altruism. For our love of neighbor to be authentic, it has to proceed from our love of God. Indeed, we don't love our neighbor except for love of God. Only God is loved for His own sake. Only He is all good and worthy of all our love. We love our neighbor because God loves our neighbor and, since we love God, we love who He loves.

The primacy of love of God also ensures that we love our neighbor *in truth*. Saint Augustine's famous line applies: *Dilige et quod vis fac* — *Love and do what you will*. It's not a recipe for hedonism ("Hey, man, if you, like, love, then everything's, like, totally cool"). Rather, it's a terse recognition that when we love properly our will becomes properly ordered and we desire the right things.

If we try to love our neighbor without loving God first, then we inevitably love falsely. Loving God first means that we love His truth and His commands. It means that we know that God's will is good for us and for all. Thus we show our love to neighbor by loving Him according to God's truth...even when that's difficult.

Think about how much harm is done in the world by way of a false love of neighbor, a counterfeit compassion. The euthanasia movement traffics in this and leads people to commit suicide or to murder their own relatives. Once truth and love are decoupled, we end up doing such things because they seem compassionate and nice. Parents will choose abortion for their daughters because it seems nice and prevents a lot of difficulties for her (so they think). And so on.

At the risk of stoking controversy, it's important to recognize the *ordo amoris*, the proper order or hierarchy of loves. We love those closest to us first and then extend outward in concentric circles: spouse, children, extended family, friends, neighbors, and so on. We don't want to become like Mrs. Jellyby from *Bleak House*. She was the mother of a large family but her time was entirely invested in doing good for children in Africa. A noble pursuit, to be sure, but her own children were neglected and living in squalor as a result.

Lord, perfect our love for You, so that we can love others as You desire and according to Your truth.



Understanding the Ramifications of the Proposed VA Constitutional Amendment on Abortion



The proposed amendment is broadly written, and it will be left to judges to interpret its meaning in the future. This opens the door for harmful interpretations of the wording by our courts. Below is another danger in the VA abortion amendment.

This proposed amendment will protect those persons who aid or assist an individual in exercising his/her “reproductive rights.” This amendment could prevent the state from prosecuting any person involved in a minor child’s “reproductive freedom,” with or without the knowledge of parents, if parental rights laws are overturned.



Lenten Meatless Recipe

Spring is in the air! This weekend, try the risotto-esque wholesome, creamy, white bean lemon pesto orzo soup below that comes together in just 20 minutes! Creamy White Bean Lemon Pesto Orzo Soup

Adapted from Half Baked Harvest



1 tablespoon of extra virgin olive oil
1 shallot, chopped
5 cloves garlic, smashed
red pepper flakes
2 tablespoons salted butter
2 cups dry orzo pasta

6 cups low sodium chicken/vegetable broth
1 can white beans
kosher salt and black pepper
½ bunch kale, finely shredded
½ cup basil pesto


½ cup whole milk or canned full-fat coconut milk
1 cup grated parmesan cheese
zest and juice of 1 lemon

Heat the olive oil in a large Dutch oven over medium-high heat. Add the shallot, garlic, and chili flakes and cook until fragrant, about 5 minutes. Drop in the butter, then stir in the orzo. Cook until golden, 1-3 minutes. Pour in the broth and bring to a boil over high heat. Season with salt and pepper. Stir in the beans and kale. Season with salt and pepper. If you have one, add a parmesan rind. Simmer 8-10 minutes until the orzo is al dente, stirring often. It should become very creamy. Stir in the pesto, milk, parmesan, and lemon, cook another few minutes until warmed through. Divide the orzo and broth among bowls and add additional parmesan and black pepper. You can add some fresh dill, parsley, or basil too.



Spring Planting

Additionally, now is the perfect time to start any seeds you'd like to plant in your garden. Search the internet for DIY seed starter pots you can make with upcycled items like egg cartons, paper towel rolls, newspaper and small boxes. Aim for transplanting your seedlings into the ground or a container in mid-May and enjoy your harvest or flowers in August. **If you happen to grow extra vegetable plants, please consider donating them to the parish garden for our spring planting!** Details to come in next week's bulletin.






