



On The Way

Redeeming Word and Body: A Lie about Word and Body

God communicates Himself to us by word and body, by speaking into being the physical world that manifests Him. Man, created in God's image and after His likeness, also communicates by word and body. Satan, envious of man as the embodied image of God, leads him astray. And he does so precisely by way of the gifts God gave him. So, one way of understanding the account of the fall is that the evil one manipulates the spoken word and the physical world to lead man and woman into sin (see Gen 3:1-6).

The deceiver begins with a distortion of words: "Did God say, 'You shall not eat of any tree of the garden'?" It's an innocent enough sounding question...as if he just wants to know. But he is actually using the words not to convey or seek the truth but to introduce doubt into the woman's mind.

For her part, she responds faithfully: "We may eat of the fruit of the trees of the garden; but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, neither shall you touch it, lest you die." To which the serpent continues his deception: "You will not die. For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil."

As always the case with a lie, there's enough truth in the serpent's words to make them believable. Evil is always parasitic, relying on good for existence. So also lying feeds on truth. Indeed, the man and woman will not die...immediately. Their eyes will in fact be opened...but not in a good way. Point is, he's using human language to deceive, to sow doubt, and ultimately to divide from

Likewise, in the temptation of the woman, the devil misrepresents God's physical creation. The conversation centers primarily on the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, but by extension on the meaning of the garden and all creation.

The Catechism explains that the forbidden tree "symbolically evokes the insurmountable limits that man, being a creature, must freely recognize and respect with trust' (CCC 396). It is a reminder of man's dependence on God, that he receives his real authority in the garden and over creation from God. The garden is a place of communion with God. The tree of the knowledge of good and evil is a reminder of our dependence on God for that communion.

God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God... The devil distorts the meaning of the physical, of the created world. He characterizes the garden – that privileged place of creation and communion - as a place of competition and rivalry instead. He implies that in His creation God is holding something back from Adam and Eve. Creation is no longer a gift but a constraint. "So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate; and she also gave some to her husband, and he ate."

The bitter irony here is that God wanted them to become like Him. He created them after His likeness, meant to grow more and more into that reality. But now, instead of receiving that likeness as a gift, they seize it as an entitlement. At the heart of this temptation is the devil's distortion and manipulation of the created world. What was meant to reveal God and be the place of His communion with man is now a realm of suspicion and rebellion.



# **Social Outreach Christmas Gift Collection**

Saint James parishioners have supported the Seven Corners Children's Center at Christmas time for

over 20 years. Unfortunately, the Center has closed due to a catastrophic roof failure which resulted in their building being condemned. They have been searching for a new location but have been unable to find a building that can support their needs. Therefore, the Social Outreach Committee will not be collecting Christmas gifts for the Center this year but is



hopeful they will be back in operation next year.

The Family Coordinator at Luther Jackson Middle School has reached out to the Social Outreach Committee concerning providing Christmas presents for their students from low income families. The school serves a large number of these families and while Fairfax County provides a number of services to them, there are no resources for extras like gifts. Therefore, we are asking parishioners to donate new, unwrapped gifts for these middle school students. Ages range from 12 to 14 and the coordinator has suggested the following gifts:

- **Sporting equipment:** all types of balls, rackets, archery sets, nets, etc.
- **Toys:** age-appropriate board games, card games, Lego sets, and craft kits
- Clothing: winter and lightweight jackets, hoodies, sweatshirts, sweaters, pants, leggings, pajamas, and socks
- Other items suggested: blankets and throws
- Clothing sizes vary at this age but general guidelines are
  - ♦ boy/girl sizes: L and XL (14-20)
  - ♦ men's sizes: S, M, and junior sizes XS to M (1-7)

# Parish Spotlight—Creation Care Ministry

Throughout the year, Saint James will be spotlighting our various ministries. We hope this will allow our parishioners to learn more about each of the ministries.

# AT A GLANCE

Ministry: Creation Care Ministry (CCM) founded in 2020

**Mission**: To provide a source of experiential education, a source of nutrition to feed the hungry, and a source of inspiration to protect our natural world.

**Origin**: CCM was born out of the environmental encyclical *Laudato Si*, written by Pope Francis in 2015, which emphasizes a moral duty to care for the created environment we find ourselves in and to manage our resources more effectively.

**Highlights**: CCM has demonstrated that for the small sacrifice of a grassy lawn, we can provide for the hungry. The giving garden is located behind the Parish House. Eagle Scout projects, including the raised beds, rainwater collection barrels, compost bins and owl boxes have greatly enhanced our efforts. Produce and herbs are donated to our own monthly Food Distribution as well as neighboring parishes—we've harvested over 250 lbs. this summer!



In addition, CCM leads educational sessions within Saint James School as well as other parish youth groups like the Girl Scouts (see below). Exposing the kids to both the simplicity of the growing process and the beauty that nature holds personalizes the "care" for the environment. Annually, CCM holds a summer 'Science Night' and invites parishioners with kids (target audience 12 and under) to explore the garden ecosystem.

**Biblical Roots**: The story of Genesis is a great place to start for those interested in Creation Care Ministry. Notice how the environment was created entirely before we were, and we were created to be stewards of it. Just as it was here before we were, it will also be here long after we are gone.

**Learn More**: Contact Adam Vogel, ministry chair, at <u>adam.vogel20@gmail.com</u>. Adam moved here from Illinois after college graduation. In addition to the CCM, Adam is a member of the Young Professionals Core Team and leads the Saint James Running Club. Adam met his wife Tess at the Saint James Running Club and two years later they were married at Saint James.

# **Creation Care Ministry and Saint James Girl Scouts**

Saint James School 4th grade Girl Scout Troop 50-230 enjoyed a science lesson behind the Parish House with Dr. Karen Bushaw-Newton, a member of our Creation Care Ministry. She taught the troop about roots and shoots, chlorophyll, the best conditions for a harvest (2023; over 300 lbs.), earthworms, and where the food from the parish garden goes (to Food for Others). The girls were able to do the last harvest of the year and collected almost 5 lbs. in tomatoes and beans. This is a great example of the educational programs for youth that the Creation Care Ministry conducts at Saint James.




