



# On The Way

Saint Augustine: Holy Desire

Saint Augustine's training was in rhetoric. As such, he had a way with words and could turn a phrase. It's not surprising, then, that he is one of the most quotable saints in history. He has more quotes in the *Catechism* than any other figure. But his pithy phrases (always more fun in the Latin than in translation) are more than just bon mots. They express his theology and spirituality. He has the capacity to capture in a few words the depth of man's relationship with God.

This is no small thing. Augustine's reverence for human words is of a piece with his devotion to the Word. "In the beginning was the Word..." Man, God's image and likeness, is the only creature in this world to whom God has given the capacity to express and convey truth by way of words. Indeed, perhaps it was just this attentiveness to the power of human words that led Augustine to become a disciple of the Word.

The most famous example of Augustine's wordsmithing comes from the *Confessions*. Augustine praises God: "[Y]ou have made us for Yourself, and our heart is restless until it rests in You." There is an immediately evident beauty to this phrase and for that reason it's probably his best-known line. But it also serves as a summary of Augustine's teaching on desire.

What to do with desire is an ancient philosophical and religious question. The stoics think that we should just repress our desires and pay no heed to any passion. Buddhism teaches that desire is the source of suffering, and that we must arrive at that place where we're free of it. Of course, these are unrealistic answers. And as often as people trivialize human desire, they fall victim to its distortion.

Augustine understood human desire as an indication that we've been created for something more. Desire is not to be ignored or overcome but *sanctified*. "The entire life of a good Christian is in fact an exercise of holy desire. You do not yet see what you long for, but the very act of desiring prepares you, so that when he comes you may see and be utterly satisfied."

In this, Augustine shows himself to be a great doctor of souls. The reason for our sorrow in this world is not desire itself but the misdirection of it. It comes from our attempts to satisfy that desire with lesser things – with pleasure, wealth, or honors.

Our culture struggles with these classic false fulfillments. But we suffer something worse. Somewhere along the way we lost the capacity to desire for noble and great things. More often than not, what we desire is comfort, a care-free life. Certainly, comfort has always been a temptation away from greater things and most of all from the greatest Good Who is God. But the means at our disposal have exacerbated that temptation.

What makes Augustine such an appealing figure is that we see him (mainly by way of his *Confessions*) struggling to make sense of and properly direct his desires. He tells us how they led him astray to seek fame and pleasure. We also hear how those desires led him to the good God. And that's just the point: honesty about what – and Whom – we desire will always lead us to Him Who is the fulfillment of all desire. It is only the one who is not honest, or who turns aside to seek only comfort, who will never arrive.

The entire life of a good Christian is in fact an exercise of holy desire. These words should shape our prayer. We will desire something – that's inescapable. Let us pray that God purifies our desires and orders them rightly, so that in all things we desire Him.

# Thank You to Saint James Parishioners


Shelter House would like to express their appreciation for our parish's overwhelming support of their Amazon wish list site this

domestic violence. This family
shelter needed every day
essential items including



hygiene items, formula, diapers, and detergent. In June, the shelter received over \$700 in donations and almost \$1,000 in July thanks to our parishioners.

Shelter House relocated to Fair Ridge which allows 85 residences versus 9 in the old location. There are currently 49 families living there and they can stay for up to one year. Families are given bed linens and cleaning supplies when they move in. Your support allows families of domestic abuse to be in a safe environment like Fair Ridge.
