

On The Way

The resurrection of the body

Saint Augustine wrote, "On no point does the Christian faith encounter more opposition than on the resurrection of the body." Well, that's not true anymore. Today, we can think of many other points on which our faith encounters much more opposition! But it is certainly true that this teaching still encounters, if not opposition, at least ignorance and bewilderment. Still, every Sunday each of us confesses not only that we believe in this teaching but that we "look forward to the resurrection of the dead." That teaching has profound importance for how we treat and pray and hope for the dead.

Job anticipates this teaching in his great prayer of hope: "But as for me, I know that my Vindicator lives, and that he will at last stand forth upon the dust; Whom I myself shall see: my own eyes, not another's, shall behold him; And from my flesh I shall see God" (Job 19:25-26).

There is no greater tribute paid to our human nature – including the human body – than that God became one of us. He was born, lived, died, rose, and ascended in his body. He is now seated at the right hand of the Father in that same body, not another. It was Thomas the Apostle's great spiritual instinct that the risen Christ must be the same – i.e., have the same body – as the crucified Christ. He needed to touch that body to confirm the witness of the others.

Christ's risen body is the pattern of our own. "He will change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body" (Phil 3:21). This is a logical requirement of the salvation of our human nature. It is the entire person – soul and body – who is saved. Even now the saints (except our Lady) are in a sense incomplete in heaven. They await their bodies.

Christ's risen body is also the principle or seed of our resurrection. "The body...is not for immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord is for the body; God raised the Lord and will also raise us by his power (1 Cor 6:13-14). This is especially true in our reception of Holy Communion. This is why in the Church's tradition, the relevant passage from the Bread of Life Discourse was read at a funeral: "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day" (Jn 6:54). It's fitting that at Sunday Mass we profess our looking forward to the resurrection prior to our receiving Holy Communion.

Of course, when discussing the resurrection of the body, people immediately ask – not without a little trepidation – *What will my body look like*? Again, in his first letter to the Corinthians, Saint Paul addresses that question: "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body will they come back?" (1 Cor 15:35) Some people get a little nervous that they will be stuck with the same uncooperative body that we all have in this life, what Saint Francis called "Brother Ass." Not to worry. Our bodies will follow the pattern of Christ's risen body in complete perfection. It will be a spiritualized body, no longer subject to the fallen, physical world. The aches and pains, sags and wrinkles, graying and balding that we endure in this world will not afflict our risen bodies in the next. Our bodies will be raised to be perfectly what they were created to be.

If God has bestowed such dignity on our bodies, we should respond in kind by showing reverence for them, even in death. That is why Christians have always taken care to bury the dead reverently and have traditionally avoided cremation. We revere our mortal remains because God does and will ultimately raise them.
