





On The Way

Anima Christi: O good Jesus, hear me.

"Can you hear me now?" was the slogan of the now-defunct Verizon Wireless ad campaign. It was a catchy phrase because it spoke to something we all know. We all want to be heard, not only by way of our cell phones but more profoundly. To be heard means more than the sound waves of our voice resonating in the other person's auricular organ. It means to be acknowledged, understood, and answered. When Jesus says, "Whoever has ears ought to hear" (Mt 11:15), he means that as a spiritual exhortation and not just an observation about human anatomy.

O good Jesus, hear me. This petition of the Anima Christi touches on this desire to be heard. We want to be heard by one another and most especially by God himself.

This plea is directed at "good" Jesus. That's kind of an odd descriptor. Now, it doesn't mean that there's another kind of Jesus, one who is not good. It doesn't mean that he's only good and not the best. It means that he is entirely good, the source of all goodness, and, more importantly, always working for our good. So we invoke "good Jesus" as a way of expressing our confidence in his goodness and his desire to do good for us.

This confidence in God's goodness is essential to prayer. Indeed, it is what God desires most, that we trust him. As Jesus teaches, it is not the number of prayers that we say that obtains a hearing but the confidence with which we say them. "And in praying do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do; for they think that they will be heard for their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him" (Mt 6:7-8). And again, "Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours" (Mk 11:24).

We also call to mind our Lord's goodness because we know our own lack of goodness, that our petitions are often imperfect. Whenever we ask something from God we are asking for some *perceived* good, what *we* think is good for us. But he alone knows the good that we need. So again we appeal to his goodness, trusting that he knows better than we.

It's helpful to consider that in Hebrew the word for *hear* is the same as *obey*. The point is that hearing always involves responding. To hear means not just passive listening but an active response to what has been said. When the prophets cry out, "Hear, O Israel!" they don't intend something for entertainment but for response and action. Again, "Whoever has ears ought to hear." So, it's a bold thing for us to say to Jesus, *Hear me*. We are implicitly commanding him to respond as well. Hence another reason to invoke his goodness and express confidence that he wants to hear – and respond.

One last detail about this petition comes from the original Latin. The usual Latin word for *hear* is *audi* (from which we have *audio*). But the word used in the *Anima Christi* is *exaudi*. The prefix *ex*- serves as an intensifier. It indicates one pleading from afar and needing to be heard urgently and thoroughly. It's not just "Can you hear me now?" but "Come quickly! Answer me promptly!"

Remember, this prayer is traditionally said after receiving Holy Communion. O good Jesus, hear me. We know that he is good because he's just given himself to us in the Eucharist. We confess our confidence in that goodness and express our desire that his goodness be made known before others by his helping us in our need.





Diocesan Golden Jubilee Pilgrimage


