



On The Way

The Seven Last Words: Mary our mother

She had interceded with him early in his ministry, at the wedding feast in Cana (see Jn 2:1-11): "They have no wine." He had given a curious response: "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." This wasn't a denial of her request but a reminder and warning. Her intercession would set into motion his work and therefore his journey to the Cross. That journey would include her. She would become no longer just his mother, but the woman prophesied in Genesis – the woman whose offspring (or whose own heel) would crush the head of the serpent (see Gen 3:15).

She didn't flinch. "Do whatever he tells you," she instructed the servers. And he changed the water into wine. "Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs in Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him." The journey to Calvary had begun.

Now what her son had intimated has become a reality (see Jn 19:25-28). She is at the foot of his Cross, watching him endure unspeakable suffering. She isn't there passively or as merely a bystander. She's his greatest conspirator in the work of salvation. He now addresses her again as "Woman." Now she is fully revealed as the woman at enmity with the serpent and crushing his head through her Son.

Now, at this moment of hidden victory, Jesus gives us to her: "Woman, behold your son." The one he entrusts to her is "the disciple whom he loved." That phrase refers immediately to the Apostle John, but by extension to every disciple of Christ. For every disciple is beloved. Thus, John is the representative for *all* disciples – indeed, for the faithful as a whole.

So, Mary receives us as her children and, suffering birth pangs at the Cross, becomes Mother of the Church. Her response to her Son's dying words is to look upon us as her own children, to take us as her own, and to direct her maternal love and solicitude to us.

Which means that we should see her as our Mother. "Behold, your mother," Jesus says to the disciple – and to all of us. Technically, we refer to her as our Mother *in the order of grace* – which doesn't mean in make believe. By grace we are so united to Christ that we participate in every aspect of his life. "For he who sanctifies and those who are sanctified have all one origin" (Heb 2:11). Our union with him by grace is so intimate and profound that through, with, and in him we call God our "Father." What Jesus is by nature, we are by grace – children of God. So also, we participate in his being the Son of Mary. Through, with, and in him we are her children as well.

"And from that hour the disciple took her into his home." The disciple whom Jesus loved cared for the widowed Mary for the rest of her life. But *took her into his home* means more than that he provided what children ought to provide for their parents. The phrase means, literally, that he took her *into his own* – into his own life, thoughts, affections, etc. He integrated Mary and devotion to her into every aspect of his life.

John then tells us, "After this, aware that everything was now finished..." This is an extraordinary line: *everything was now finished*. Our Lord's work was not complete until he had given his Mother and us to one another. So also now, he completes his work within us by way of Mary, when we take her into our own.

Lenten Meatless Recipes

Each week during Lent, members of the Creation Care Ministry will be sharing their favorite meatless recipes in the bulletin.

Mexican Sweet Potato Soup

(Adapted from the Food Network)

Ingredients	
3 medium/large sweet potat	oes (peeled and cubed)
1 28 oz can diced tomatoes	-
2 Tbsp olive oil	2 Tbsp cumin
Tortillas	avocado, Mexican chees

1/2 an onion chopped2 cloves garlic minced4 cups low sodium vegetable broth/stock1 cup spinach1 limeese (for garnish)

Directions

You can use an Instant Pot or a regular pot. Sauté the onions in olive oil until translucent. Add the garlic and cumin. Mix for at least 30 seconds. Add the potatoes (move for a minute or so). Salt to taste. Add tomatoes & vegetable broth/stock. If using an Instant Pot, cook in the pressure cooker for 12 minutes. If using a regular pot, cook until the potatoes are soft and you can insert a fork. When done, add lime juice and salt to taste. Add spinach and serve. Top with tortilla strips. Simply cut tortillas in strips, add a bit of olive oil and bake in the oven until crispy but not burned

(350°F for ~7 minutes, more or less.) OPTIONS: Add avocado or cheese for garnish. Add protein such as cooked or canned kidney beans, cannellini beans, garbanzos, or red lentils (add when cooking the potatoes.)
