






The Pope's September Prayer Intention

On The Way

Anima Christi: and hid me come to Thee.

It's a curious thing to command God. Given his omnipotence and the infinite distance between him and us, you would expect our prayers to be deferential and submissive. And most of them are. But in many instances, we don't ask God at all but instead command him. Some "petitions" of the Our Father, for example, are not submissive but imperative: give us...forgive us...deliver us... This is not the imperative of rudeness but of needy children who often abruptly blurt out their need. In the Psalms and likewise in the Mass we cry out, *Remember!* Again, it's a command given by those in need, the People of God begging God not to forget them.

...and bid me come to Thee. This line from the Anima Christi is no petition but a blunt command. Bid me. Further compounding this bluntness, the Latin for "bid" is iube, which means order or command. So, we're not just commanding God but we're commanding him to command us to come to him.

But should we need to be commanded? Shouldn't we want to come to him? Shouldn't we race to him? Of course we should. But we know that in our weakness we don't. He beckons to us in the Gospels: Come to me all you who labor...Come and see...Come, follow me. But we hesitate, delay, and fail to respond. We're up against the weakness of our will. So, we desire that God accomplish what our feeble will cannot: Bid me come to Thee.

Anyone who takes the Christian life seriously has run into this problem. We desire to run to the Lord...but we lack the strength. As our Lord saint to Saint Peter, "The spirit is willing, but the flesh (Mt 26:41). Saint Paul expressed the same phenomenon: "For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do" (Rom 7:19). We grow tired with our own freedom and want God to take over. Thus, John Donne wrote,

Batter my heart, three-person'd God, for you As vet but knock, breathe, shine, and seek to mend; That I may rise and stand, o'erthrow me, and bend Your force to break, blow, burn, and make me new.

In his Confessions, Saint Augustine resolves this dilemma neatly: Give what you command, O Lord, and then command whatever you will. This little prayer expresses the confidence that God will never command what he doesn't also give us the grace to do. His commands are demanding. But they're not impossible, because in giving a command he gives the grace to fulfill it. So, we command him - Bid me come to Thee – fully confident that in his giving that command he will enable us to respond. He will be the author of our coming to him.

The inspiration for this line most certainly comes from Saint Peter's walking on the water (see Mt 14:25-33). When the Apostle saw Jesus walking on the water, he called out, "Lord, if it is you, bid me come to you on the water." Our Lord responded, "Come!" We know the story. Peter – trusting in our Lord's command – got out of the boat and walked on the water towards Jesus. But when he paid more attention to the wind and the waves than to our Lord's command, he began to sink. What was wanting on Peter's part was trust in the Lord's command.

So also for us. He only commands what is for our good. And when he commands, he also gives what he commands. So we can confidently call out, Bid me come to Thee.



Professor Helen Alvaré Wednesday, October 23rd 7:00pm in Monsignor Heller Hall



Helen Alvaré is a Professor of Law at Antonin Scalia Law School at George Mason University, teaching Family Law, Law and Religion, and Property Law. She serves as a Member of the Holy See's Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life, a board member of Catholic Relief Services, and an ABC news consultant. She cooperates with the Permanent Observer Mission of the Holy See to the United Nations as a speaker and a delegate to various United Nations conferences concerning women and the family.

Professor Alvaré received her law degree from Cornell University School of Law and her master's degree in Systematic Theology from the Catholic University of America.


Volunteer will cross-train with the current volunteer responsible for this ministry, Carol Breen.

Life Chain



Devotion to the Sacred and Immaculate Hearts

First Friday Devotion—Sacred Heart of Jesus

Starting in 1693, Jesus appeared for over two years to St. Margaret Mary Alocoque, a Visantine nun in France. During the apparitions Jesus showed her his Sacred Heart and lamented how sorrowful he was because so many people neither loved him nor trusted him. Many Catholics at the time rarely received Holy Communion, fearing they were not worthy. Jesus asked her to spread devotion to the Sacred Heart and he made known his desire that the First Friday of every month be a time for special devotion to his Heart. The faithful should receive him in Holy Communion with the intention of consoling him and making reparation for sins against him, especially in the Eucharist.

Jesus also made many promises to those who would consecrate the first Friday of the month to the Sacred Heart and who would make reparation for the sins of the world. To read the promises, visit this link, https://www.ewtn.com/catholicism/library/12-promises-of-the-sacred-heart-13683.



First Saturday Devotion—Triumph of the Immaculate Heart

In the end, My Immaculate Heart will Triumph. (July 13, 1917 Our Lady of Fatima) Our Lady of Fatima said that the last battle would be against the family, and here we are. On December 10, 1925, the Blessed Mother appeared to Sr. Lucia, the remaining survivor of the children of Fatima, and told her: "My child, behold My Heart surrounded with the thorns which ungrateful men place therein at every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. Announce in My name that I promise to assist at the hour of death, all those who, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months, shall:

- 1. Go to confession (within 8 days) and receive Holy Communion.
- 2. Pray the Rosary.
- 3. Keep Me company for 15 minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary.
- 4. Do all of this with the intention of making reparation to Me.

I promise to assist them at the hour of their death with all the graces necessary to save their souls."

Why five Saturdays? Because of blasphemies against the Immaculate Conception, Her Virginity, Her Divine Maternity, of those who publicly seek to sow in the hearts of children indifference or scorn, or even hatred of this Immaculate Mother, the offenses of those who outrage Her directly in Her Holy Images. Jesus told Sr. Lucia, "Here, My daughter, is the reason why the Immaculate Heart of Mary inspired Me to ask for this little act of reparation ..."

In honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed on the **first Friday night**, October 4th, at 7:30pm and Adoration will continue throughout the night and conclude with the 8:30am Mass on Saturday morning, October 5th.

Please commit to spend some time before our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament—to receive his love, to return love for love. The parish provides books and pamphlets for Adoration and for making reparation. See the basket in the foyer. Please return the materials to the basket when finished.


