



On The Way

Saint Augustine: Pelagianism and Original Sin

The Pelagian heresy got two fundamental truths wrong: fallen human nature and the grace of God. Now, we should appreciate that Pelagius and his followers were trying to integrate two essential and seemingly contradictory truths: our free will and God's grace. They wouldn't be the last to make a wreck of this by choosing one over the other. It's a reminder that whenever we encounter a mystery of two such things, the rule is that we should allow the tension between them to remain. We need that tension for the beauty of our faith, as a violin string needs tension to make a beautiful sound. But we frequently grow frustrated, tack to one extreme, and ruin the beautiful tension.

This is what the Pelagians did regarding original sin. They contended that we were not implicated in the sin of Adam. For them, original sin was just a bad example and did not deal a wound to our shared human nature. We still possess that perfection and just need to dust it off and get with the program.

This noble view of the human condition sounds wonderful at first. Much better than the dark Manichaean view that half of us is evil. But it quickly becomes incredibly harsh, because it means that it all depends on you. If you are not yet perfect, it's simply because you're not trying hard enough. And what's wrong with you that you're still struggling and haven't gotten your act together yet?

G.K. Chesterton once quipped original sin was "the only part of Christian theology which can really be proved." It's all around us. Just so, Augustine was strong (some would say too strong) in teaching the truth of our fallen human nature. Namely, that we share a human nature wounded by Adam's rebellion against the Creator. Just as we stood to inherit from him all the original blessings of human nature, so now we have inherited instead a wounded nature. Adam was to pass on to us a graced human nature. By his rebellion he has handed on a dis-graced human nature.

All of this sounds rather harsh. But it is in fact consoling because it makes sense of what we see and points to the way out. After all, we all recognize that there's something terribly wrong with the world. Yes, we see order and goodness. But we also see chaos and evil. Now, if what's wrong with the world is something out there done by other people (as thought by Pelagians then and Marxists now), then we need to correct those who are to blame (And who are they? The Jews? The blacks? Landowners? Every ideology has its culprit.) and spare no expense in reshaping society.

But if what's wrong with the world is interior...if it's something inside each of us and unreachable by human institutions...then we're all implicated. It's not just one group or race or nation but all of us who are wounded and wounding. In which case, we need a Savior from outside of us who can heal the inside of us. Try as we might, we cannot do it ourselves. Thus, God Himself enters the world in order to enter our souls and bring healing.

Thus did Augustine teach in opposition to the harsh doctrine of the Pelagians. He himself had been a successful man in the world who could not conquer his passions. He knew well the weakness of human nature and the need for a Redeemer. So he also proclaimed a Church that is patient with the wavering and weak, a place where they can receive healing and strength. All of that, of course, is the work of grace – which will be taken up next week.



In addition to your child's birth certificate, you will need to provide the following:

- Baptismal certificate if your child was not baptized at Saint James
- Tuition via check or cash
 - \Rightarrow \$140 for one child
 - \Rightarrow \$190 for two or more children
- Letter from the school or parish program if your child was in another Catholic school or religious education program
