

On The Way

Seven New Words: Peace be with you.

Having reflected on our Lord's seven last words throughout the course of Lent, it seems only appropriate to give some time (in fact, seven weeks) to considering what our Lord said after his resurrection from the dead. Surely, these words are also important. They are the words of the Risen One, the Conqueror of sin and death. They are the Bridegroom's greeting to his Bride, the Church, to whom he imparts his risen life.

It's fitting to consider first the most conspicuous and the most frequently repeated words of the risen Christ: *Peace be with you* (Jn 20:19, 21, 26; cf. Lk 24:36). This is how he greets the Apostles in the Upper Room on Easter Sunday itself. Of course, it wasn't an unusual greeting. *Shalom* was a greeting in the Old Testament and still is among devout Jews today. But there is something more in our Lord's *Peace be with you* than a regular greeting, such as "Good morning" or "Good day."

Peace is a strong theme throughout our Lord's life. His birth was greeted by the angels singing "peace on earth." During his Last Supper discourse (in that same Upper Room), he said to the Apostles, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you" (Jn 14:27). And he summarized that discourse by saying, "I have said this to you, that in me you may have peace" (16:33).

All his words about peace find their fulfillment in the Crucifixion. It is on the Cross that he heals the disharmony and conflict that comes from our alienation from God. For our being alienated from him leads to division also within ourselves, from one another, and from creation. By his death on the Cross, Christ reconciles us with the Father – sets us at peace with him – and thus reestablishes that harmony originally intended – within ourselves, among ourselves, and with creation. As Saint Paul bluntly states, "He is our peace" (Eph 2:14).

Jesus' Easter greeting is in effect a declaration that he had accomplished what he had promised. He had triumphed. On the Cross on Good Friday, he established peace. In the Upper Room on Easter Sunday, he extends that peace to the Apostles. He shares with them the victory and fruit of the crucifixion. He shows them his wounds as the trophies of his triumph, and he greets them with the word that summarizes it.

The secular world sees peace as merely the lack of open hostility or aggression. The biblical understanding of *shalom*, on the other hand, is much deeper. It has the sense of wholeness and harmony that makes one secure, well, and happy. That is what our Lord won for us on the Cross.

The context of our Lord's greeting is also significant. The Apostles are hiding in the Upper Room out of fear. They fear suffering a death like his. They fear their own weakness and infidelity. Then, suddenly and without warning, Christ stands before them and extends to them the very thing they desire most: *Peace*. Not that this fixes their situation. They could still be persecuted and even executed. But interiorly, it makes all the difference. For if we have the peace of Christ within, then no external difficulty can undo us.

The Church has incorporated this greeting of *Peace* into her own life. The risen Christ not only wished peace to the nascent Church but *entrusted* his peace to her. The Church's mission is nothing less than to be the bearer of Christ's peace to all mankind throughout the world and throughout the centuries. Let us draw close to the risen Christ and allow him to make us peacemakers like him.
