



On The Way

Redeeming Word and Body: Our Redeeming Word

We all know the power of words. They can build up or tear down, enlighten or deceive. Unfortunately, in our weakness we often use our words not to build up or enlighten but to tear down and deceive. Jesus Christ, the eternal Word, has redeemed human words. He has brought healing to this wound of original sin that leads us to abuse human speech. What is more, the human word is not only healed by the divine Word but is also made an instrument of extending His redemptive grace.

This means first and foremost that we can speak truly about God. Which might seem to be obvious. Yet there are so-called intellectuals who claims that human words have no meaning, that they are just instruments of power and not truth. (Oddly, they use words to make this claim...) Further, what Cardinal Newman called "liberalism" in religion holds that human speech doesn't capture anything true about God. It only expresses opinions or sentiments about the divine. The deeper and more threatening claim, of course, is that there is nothing true in religion anyway.

Contrary to these views that empty human speech of its power, the Church holds that the human word has been entrusted with the power to communicate not just natural but divine truth. Indeed, the Church's entire mission of teaching saving doctrine is founded on this principle. The Word of God breathed life into the Church, so it should not surprise us that His Church has always been the defender of the interior word of human thought and the external word of human speech. We can know the truth about God, we can express it, and we can communicate it to others. The creeds we profess (e.g., the Apostles and the Nicene) and the catechisms we read express the truth about God. That truth — that comes to us in human words — makes the act of faith possible.

Using our words to communicate God's truth is more than just passing on information. As Saint Paul writes to the Ephesians, "Let no evil talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for edifying, as fits the occasion, *that it may impart grace* to those who hear" (Eph 4:29, emphasis added). Our words can impart, can be the vehicles of, God's grace.

Further, the manner of our speech should be in accord with its content. Nobody says "I love you" in a hostile tone or with a frown. Nor should we speak of divine truths in a manner that lacks charity or joy. Jesus' human nature was the instrument worthy of His divinity. So also, we should speak (as much as we are able) in a manner worthy of divine content.

The dignity of the human word is nowhere more in evidence than in our prayer. "God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth" (Jn 4:24). Human speech's highest use is in conversation with God. We pray true things. First of all, the truth about ourselves. In our prayer, we are to be honest and authentic with God. Not putting on a face for Him but allowing Him to see us as we are, in the sometimes-brutal truth of our condition.

To worship in spirit and truth also means that we pray according to the truth about God. This is how creeds and catechisms intersect with prayer. "There is an organic connection between our spiritual life and the dogmas. Dogmas are lights along the path of faith; they illuminate it and make it secure" (CCC 89). Any relationship requires truthfulness. The Church teaches us the truth about God so that we can pray to Him not as we imagine or hope Him to be, not as an opinion or sentiment of ours, but as He is.


