## On The Way

*The Apostles: Praying with Peter*

Having considered our Lord's words, we now turn to Peter's responses. Now, Peter's most attractive personality trait is his candor. We never wonder what he's thinking. Especially in front of our Lord, to Whom he is so devoted, Peter cannot help but unburden his heart. What we might perceive as his emotional outbursts are really cries of the heart. We want to make his bursts of our prayer our own, so that we can respond as generously as he did.

*Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets* (Lk 5:5). This is a pray of trust. With his customary candor, Peter makes the difficulty of the situation clear – and then he places everything in Jesus' hands. Notice that he trusts when asked to do something risky and seemingly absurd. Trust is easy when in the comfort of our own home, lounging around in pajamas, sitting in oversized furniture, sipping herbal tea. It becomes a different thing when the Lord beckons us out of safety, to an adventure with Him. Peter responds with the trust that pushes away from the shore's safety and dares something. It is the obedience of faith – the trust that prompts a man to take up the Christian life despite its absurdity to the world.

*Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water* (Mt 14:28). This is a prayer of magnanimity. There was no need to walk on water. Peter could have remained in the boat with the others. But there's something untamed about Peter's love for Christ. He wants to do great things for Him and with Him. Notice how Peter's trust in Jesus has grown since their first encounter. He now dares something greater than just going into the deep end. Now he wants to walk on the deep.

*You are the Christ, the Son of the living God* (Mt 16:16). This is a profession of faith. Peter articulates the truth of what he had known only vaguely. He had trusted Jesus, had dared things for Him. Now he articulates why he found the Carpenter of Galilee worthy of that devotion, trust, and faith: He is the Messiah, the Son of God. This is not a notion or idea. Nor is it a sterile, cold fact. It is the truth of the One to Whom Peter entrusts Himself. He invests everything in this truth – as should we.

*Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life* (Jn 6:68). But we do go to others. We try to find answers in other ideas, philosophies, or ideologies. We try to solve our problems with created things. We forget that it's Christ or nothing. This is a Eucharistic prayer, wonderful words to say prior to Communion or when making a visit to the Church. It's a prayer that acknowledges the insufficiency of everything else, the uniqueness of Christ, and the superabundance of Christ's presence in the Eucharist.

*Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you* (Jn 21:17). This is a wonderful prayer of love. Wonderful because it's modest. That the Lord knows everything and knows that we love Him means that He knows how weak, fickle, and fragile our love for Him is. Like Peter, we make bold promises and resolutions and then fail time and time again. But the Lord's knowledge of all things and of our love also means that He knows how much we desire to love Him, how we struggle to love Him as He deserves, and how much we need His help to do so.

May Saint Peter intercede for us, to gain for us the candor, faith, love, and perseverance that we so admire in him.
