



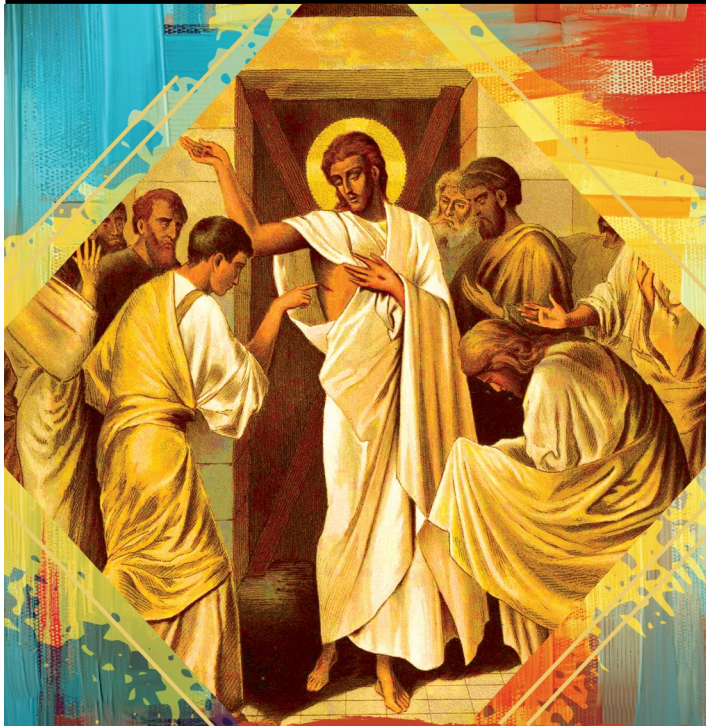

## On The Way

*Seven New Words: Whom do you seek?*

“When [Christ] had risen, early on the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had driven seven demons” (Mk 16:9). That’s the typically laconic account from Mark’s Gospel. John’s gives a more detailed version of the encounter between the risen Christ and this woman (Jn 20:11-18). As John tells it, after the others leave the empty tomb pondering what it means, Mary remains there weeping. Jesus then appears to her, but she doesn’t recognize him. He then asks, “Woman, why are you weeping?” After her response, he asks again, “Woman, why are you weeping? Whom do you seek?”

*Whom do you seek?* The first words of the risen Christ to the Magdalene are not a statement or greeting but a series of questions, culminating in this most important one. His questioning picks up on a theme throughout Scripture. God’s first words to Adam and Eve after the fall are a question: “Where are you?” (Gen 3:9) With this question he wants us to know that his response to our rebellion is not to reject us but to seek us out.

God also wants us to understand that even as he seeks us, we seek him. Problem is, the human heart is an undisciplined seeker. We know that we seek. We know that we desire something, perhaps even someone. But we don’t know exactly what or who. And our undisciplined seeking – our grasping in darkness and ignorance – does great damage. We harm ourselves and others by our settling on things unworthy of us. Our seeking hearts need to be trained.

Thus, upon coming into the world he teaches us how, what, and whom to seek. At the beginning of his ministry, Jesus asks the disciples, “What do you seek?” (Jn 1:38) He knows what they seek. It is they who need to learn the true desire of their hearts. Likewise in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus steps forward and asks the band of soldiers and guards, “Whom do you seek?” (Jn 18:4) Even they are seeking, but in ignorance. Their hostility and violence in the garden show how our undisciplined seeking causes grave harm, even to Christ himself.

Now on Easter morning, the same God who sought Adam and Eve in that first garden seeks Mary in the garden outside the tomb. *Woman, why are you weeping?* At the same time, he teaches her to seek him – or, rather, that he is the one she seeks. *Whom do you seek?* In the garden of the tomb, Mary seeks the One seeking her.

We can understand Mary not only as an example for all Christians but as an image of the Church herself. She went to the tomb early, while it was still dark. While the rest of the world sleeps, her heart is awake to the reality of Christ and goes to the tomb. Even as the others depart and, in a sense, give up the search, she remains there. She constantly seeks Jesus Christ and will not be content with anything less.

The world is in darkness. Most have lapsed into a moral slumber and seek fulfillment in base pleasures. But the Church – like the Magdalene – is ever awake to Christ, seeking him even in the darkness. While others have given up the search and turned aside to lesser things, the Church perseveres and remains.

Finally, Mary persevered in her witness despite opposition even from other disciples. “They did not believe” (Mk 16:11) and it “seemed like nonsense” to them (Lk 24:11). Like the Magdalene, the Church stands fast in her witness to the resurrection of Christ, despite the world’s disbelief and ridicule.

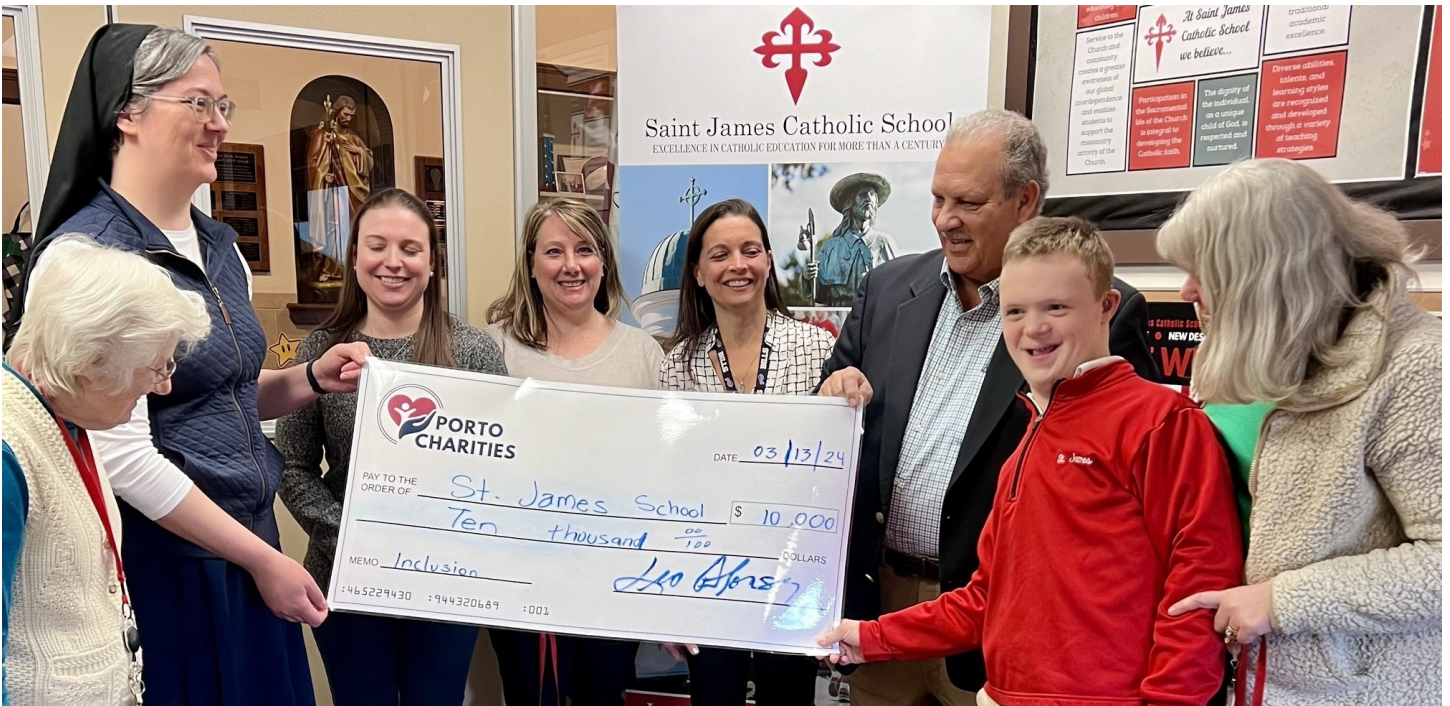
