



On The Way

Saint Augustine: Unity of Life

Pope Leo's episcopal motto is *In Illo uno unum – In the One, we are one*. It is adapted from one of Saint Augustine's writings on the Psalms: "When I speak of Christians in the plural, I understand *one in the One Christ*. You are therefore many, and you are one; we are many, and we are one. How are we many, and yet one? Because we cling unto Him whose members we are." One in the one Christ thus becomes *In Illo uno unum*.

With this phrase, now more prominent because the Pope is an Augustinian, we encounter another common theme in Augustine's thought: unity. And, more specifically, the one Christ who heals the disunity caused by sin. It touches on the classic philosophical question of the one and the many. But that philosophical question is only resolved in the Person of Christ, through Whom all was brought into being (see Jn 1:3) and in Whom the Father has restored all things (see Eph 1:10).

Unity was first a personal issue for Augustine. In the *Confessions* he recounts his "past foulness" and carnal corruptions." He recalls, "my dissipation, in which I was torn to pieces, while, turned away from You the One, I lost myself among many vanities" *In multa evanui* – literally, *I vanished into the many*. With this language, Augustine certainly had in mind the Prodigal Son (see Lk 15:11-32), who fell into "dissolute" living, into a lifestyle that is dissolved and in pieces, lacking any center or unity.

Sin divides. Its first and principal effect is to divide us from God. And thus separated from the One, we experience many divisions in our lives. First, within ourselves: our intellect, will, and passions – meant to work as one – are at odds with one another. The passions rise up and commandeer our rational soul. So that instead of choosing according to the truth we choose according to our feelings and drag the intellect along to justify what we've chosen.

It is due to sin also that we experience division between body and soul, man and woman, brothers, and nations. Our alienation from and abuse of creation comes from our being divided from the One Creator. And so on. In God's design, these were to be one organic whole. It is because of sin in the world – both original sin and our own particular sins – that we find them divided and so often at odds.

As the Church would teach centuries later, at Vatican II, "[Man] suffers from internal divisions, and from these flow so many and such great discords in society." The divisions we see in society are not healed by better politics or economics but only by turning back to the One from Whom all things come and to Whom they are to return. (Hence Pope Leo's recent exhortation to legislators to acquaint themselves with Augustine's *City of God.*)

Having wandered into Manichaeism and then Neoplatonism, Augustine still found himself at odds with himself. He could say with Saint Paul, "What I do, I do not understand. For I do not do what I want, but I do what I hate" (Rom 7:15). All his learning and prestige had failed to heal that. He finally discovered that only in Christ – the One – could he come to have a unity of life. Only in Christ could he find healing of sins divisions within him.

In Illo uno unum – In the One, we are one. Like Augustine, we find ourselves divided and torn in many directions. We crave unity of life, a way of living in which we have peace within ourselves and with others. That will never be perfect this side of heaven, but in the one Christ, by His grace and truth, we find healing of our divisions and thus peace for our souls.


