Grace and the Theological Virtues

Last week we began considering the theological virtues and their newness in the world. But why should these new things be necessary at all? Indeed, that was a question early in the Church's history. The monk Pelagius asserted that we don't really need grace, nor the new virtues that come with it. In his estimation, Jesus gave us the example of how to live and our human virtues are enough to imitate him – if only we get our act together and, you know, *try harder*.

Saint Augustine was the great figure who countered this heresy. He insisted on our absolute need for grace to live the Christian life – hence his awesome nickname, the "Doctor of Grace." Our need for grace arises first from our fallen human nature. We need an interior healing in order to respond to God. But we also need grace to live the higher life to which the Christian is called. Point is, we're not just called to a noble and good natural life in this world. No, we have been made "sharers in the divine nature" (2 Pt 1:4) and are thus called to holiness of life. We lose sight of the importance of the theological virtues when we lose sight of our divine calling.

Sanctifying grace gives us a rebirth as children of God. We are a "new creation" (2 Cor 5:17), as Saint Paul says. And that new creation needs a new operating system, new virtues to live the new life. Each thing acts according to what it is. Since we *are* a new creation in Christ, we need a greater capacity to *act* in accord with that reality. The natural human virtues remain essential. But to live the truth of who we are – and to get to where we're going – something more is needed. By nature, we are created for natural happiness and hence cultivate natural virtues. By grace, we are recreated for supernatural happiness – for "the life which is life indeed" (1 Tim 6:19). The theological virtues direct us to that supernatural happiness for which our own virtues are necessary but insufficient.

These virtues direct us to what is more than human, but they still correspond to our human nature. In a beautiful way, God proportions himself to us. By his grace he doesn't run roughshod over our human nature but gives us virtues so that we can deepen in our union with him. According to an important principle, God's grace does not destroy but perfects our human nature. Holiness of life is not alien to who we are.

As such, Saint Thomas Aquinas observes that faith, hope, and charity correspond to our intellect and our will. We receive something supernatural to direct us to a supernatural end. So, by way of *faith*, man receives a divine light in his intellect to know the truths necessary for salvation. By way of hope, man's will is strengthened to strive for the blessings promised to him. By way of love, man's will is united to the supernatural end, which is God himself.

Finally, a word about the order of the theological virtues (again, to remind us that these are in accord with reason and our human nature). In terms of perfection, charity is the highest, then hope, and then faith. In terms of generation, the ascent is from faith, to hope, to charity. By faith we apprehend the object of our hope and love, the highest good of God himself. By hope, we have confidence in obtaining that good. By love, we are already now united with God.

It is that order that we will observe in considering each of the theological virtues in turn.




### Parish Christmas Project for the Seven Corners Children's Center
