On The Way

The Apostles: Peter's Faith and Love

The Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke) all provide the same basic, essential information about Peter's life. The Gospel of John provides us some additional accounts that fill out our understanding of Peter's discipleship and leadership. Two merit reflection.

First, Peter's confession of faith. The Synoptics tell us about Peter's words at Caesarea-Philippi: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Mt 16:130-20; see Mk 8:27-30; Lk 9:18-20). John tells us about another moment that serves as a kind of parallel to that. After the Bread of Life discourse (Jn 6:22-59), when "many of his disciples drew back and no longer went about with him," our Lord turns to the Twelve and asks plaintively, "Do you also wish to go away?" (Jn 6:66-67)

The question resembles His question in the Synoptics: "But who do you say that I am?" It's our Lord's appeal to His closest disciples for understanding and recognition. And again, Peter steps forward and speaks on behalf of the others: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life; and we have believed, and have come to know, that you are the Holy One of God" (Jn 6:68).

In the Synoptics, Peter's confession of faith was followed by a teaching about the Church: "You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church..." Thus his confession of faith provides the firm foundation for the Church. In John's Gospel, the context is Eucharistic, coming right after the Bread of Life discourse. Peter confesses – on behalf of the entire Church – faith in our Lord's words about the Eucharist. Of course, these two are complementary. As the sacramental Body of Christ, the Eucharist makes the Church, the mystical Body of Christ. So also, Peter's confession of faith in the Eucharist builds up the Church.

Second, Peter's confession of love. All four Gospels recount Peter's threefold denial of Christ, but only John records Peter's rehabilitation. It happens on the shore of Lake Tiberias (the Sea of Galilee), when the risen Christ appears to the disciples and prepares an odd breakfast of bread and fish on a charcoal fire (see Jn 21).

After breakfast, Jesus draws Peter aside and asks him, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?...Simon, son of John, do you love me?...Simon, son of John, do you love me?" He asks three times so that by answering Peter can undo his threefold denial: "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you...Yes, Lord; you know that I love you...Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." That threefold profession of love restores Peter.

Further, after each response of love, Jesus commissions Peter as His shepherd: "Feed my lambs...Tend my sheep...Feed my sheep." Thus, Peter reveals that the most important quality in a shepherd is love for Jesus Christ. Love for the chief Shepherd (1 Pt 5:4) prompts a man to serve the flock. John was the Beloved Apostle. Paul was the great theologian and writer. But Peter excelled in his love for Jesus. His primacy is first in love and then in leadership.

Finally, it is in light of that threefold profession of love that our Lord proclaims Peter's martyrdom: "Truly, truly, I say to you, when you were young, you girded yourself and walked where you would; but when you are old, you will stretch out your hands, and another will gird you and carry you where you do not wish to go." (This he said to show by what death he was to glorify God.) Peter's failure to love once led him to deny Christ. Now that his love has been restored and strengthened, he will go on to do what he had always desired, give his life for Christ.






Saint James School Gala Needs Your Help




