

On The Way

The Theological Virtues: Loving God in our Worship

The good that we will for God is His glory. That is how we love Him. Now, this might sound somewhat sterile and detached from real life. So, let's try to put some flesh on the bones.

The first and most important way we glorify God is by our worship. We are created for this purpose. Man is the summit and in that way the "priest" of all creation. All created things — stones, plants, animals — glorify God in their own way. "The heavens declare the glory of God; the firmament proclaims the works of his hands" (Ps 19:1). But only in the human person do they all find voice. That is the purpose of our stewardship of creation, to tend it in such a way that it becomes more what it can be and in that way glorifies God.

Fallen man worships wrongly. "You worship what you do not know," Jesus says to the Samaritan woman (Jn 4:22). Because we are created to worship, we seek some way to do so. All of history is, in a certain sense, the account of man grasping for the right way to worship. But fallen man is easily misled and in his pride he often constructs his own form of worship. This has led to such abominations as child sacrifice and cultic prostitution.

Jesus Christ, God himself, institutes the proper and perfect form of worship in the Eucharist. The Mass is the perfect act of worship because it is God the Son offering himself to the Father. We are incorporated into that. In the Mass we find the perfect way of doing what we are created to do.

This is why Vatican II states that the liturgy "is a sacred action surpassing all others; no other action of the Church can equal its efficacy by the same title and to the same degree." All the other works of the Church — her teaching, her caring for the sick, her service of the poor, etc. — all of them are secondary to worship. Further, they depend on worship to be rightly directed and to receive the grace for their success. Any work of love for others must always be preceded by this primary work of love for God.

When we worship we set aside both time and space for God's glory. And that's a sign of love, that He's worth it. Further, the more we invest ourselves in the Mass, the more we manifest our love for God and grow in that love. We have to resist the tendency to think of the Mass as a time for instruction or community building. If those things come to us (and I hope they do), then they do so as an effect of our worship, not its purpose. This is the essence of the angelic hymn: Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to people of good will. The more we seek His glory, the more His peace —in the full meaning of shalom — redounds to

This is a timely consideration. Lent is ordered toward the establishment of that perfect worship. At the end of his forty days in the Ark, Noah worshipped God by sacrifice. At the end of forty days, the Israelites arrived at Sinai to worship. At the end of forty days of journeying, Elijah returned to that same mountain of worship. So our Lord leads us through these forty days to worship — not the sacrifice of animals but of His own life on the Cross. He has left us the Eucharist as the memorial, the re-presentation, of that sacrifice so that we can worship the Father in spirit and in truth. Our Lenten resolutions should be directed to a more dignified, attentive, and devoted participation in the Mass.



Understanding the Ramifications of the Proposed VA Constitutional Amendment on Abortion—The proposed amendment is broadly written and will be left to judges to interpret its meaning in the future. This opens the door for harmful interpretations of the wording by our courts. This week we will spotlight another danger in the VA abortion amendment.

• This week's spotlight: Not only could this amendment be used to remove parental rights over a minor regarding an abortion, but it could also be used to overturn other parental rights. The reference to individual includes both males and females, so it applies to minor boys as well as minor girls. Both will have a right to protection of their "reproductive freedom." You can search "Text of VA SJ247" or "Text of VA HJ1" and read this proposed amendment.






