On The Way

Redeeming Word and Body: Man's Communication

Alone among the world's creatures, man is created in God's image and after His likeness. So, just as God communicates Himself by word (He speaks and it comes into being) and by body (the physical world tells us about Him), so also man communicates by word and body. This is both a gift and a task from our Creator.

The earthy, anthropomorphic language of Genesis 2 reveals how man communicates through his body. "Then the LORD God formed man of dust from the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living being" (Gen 2:7). To be the living being that is man means to be both physical and spiritual. Man is not a soul with a body but one organism that is body and soul as one. That the Lord God forms us "of the dust from the ground" indicates that the body, the physical, is essential to who we are. (Indeed, it's interesting that He forms the body *first.*) That He breathes life into us shows that our soul, our animating spirit, comes from Him directly.

The body is thus not just a physical reality. It is a physical reality that makes present and *communicates* a spiritual reality. Saint John Paul II calls the body the "sacrament of the person." A sacrament is some physical reality that reveals and communicates the spiritual. So, the human body makes present, reveals, and communicates one's soul. Again, Saint John Paul II: "The body, in fact, and only the body, is capable of making visible what is invisible: the spiritual and the divine." You cannot see, hear, or touch the soul. The spiritual reality of our being the image and likeness of God is communicated and manifested by our bodies.

We all intuit this. We presume that a person's outward demeanor communicates something about the person's interior disposition (even when we don't always interpret it correctly). We understand physical expressions and postures – a smile or a frown; walking tall or hunched over; head held high or drooping – as indications of a person's interior status: whether he's happy, sad, confident, beaten down, optimistic or discouraged, etc.

Later in Genesis 2 we read that the Lord God creates another body from Adam's body: "So the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and while he slept took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh; and the rib which the LORD God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man" (Gen 2:21-22). Looking upon the woman's body, the man immediately knows about this creature. Her body communicates to him that she shares his human nature (she's not one of the animals!) and yet at the same time is different from him. Because of this sameness and difference, he can have a union with her that he cannot with any other creature.

In the natural order, the most profound communication of the body is when a man and woman gives themselves in the marital act. Then, the body *speaks* of self-gift and of acceptance of the other. The union of bodies in marriage is not just physical, because the body itself is never just physical. By their bodies, spouses communicate not just this that or other thing but their very selves to one another.

"And the man and his wife were both naked, and were not ashamed" (Gen 2:25). This beautiful line expresses the harmony between body and soul that God intended from the beginning. The body was to be the perfect sacrament of the soul, to manifest the divine image and likeness in the world, to communicate the person.

Behind the Scenes—Saint James Operations Fall 2025 Update

Let Angel-Shine forth in my life out flame!—Edward Taylor

As we strive to reflect God's love by shining in His light, the discerning eye can see God's loving light shining everywhere.

Our Mass attendance is shining. During October, we averaged 3,260 attendees at our seven weekend Masses, up +10% from last year. But there's always room for more! Averaging across all Masses, we are using only 58% of our seating capacity (800).

Our finances are also shining. The first quarter of Fiscal Year 2026 ended on September 30th. During the quarter, Offertory was up +5% over budget, and Total Income was up +8%. As a result, our Net Operating Income for the quarter was +\$78,244 better than what we had budgeted. We do have some large capital expenses coming, however, including further necessary improvements to our School's aging heating/cooling systems that could run \$800,000 or more.

Finally, our campus is shining, literally, from this past summer's projects which include: renovation of eight restrooms in the School and Monsignor Heller Hall, repainting of classrooms throughout the School, crack-sealing and restriping of the Teacher's Lot. There is plenty of work still to be done, but it's good to pause and rejoice in the light we see between swings of the hammer.







Retired Religious Fund November 15-16

Next weekend, our second collection will be for the Retired Religious Fund. Saint James takes up this collection each year for our retired priests and religious. Sadly, changing demographics, rising health care costs, and lack of funding are making it increasingly difficult for religious orders to care for those who have given their lives to God.

During the early and mid-twentieth centuries, the Catholic Church in the United States experienced a surge in vocations to religious life, with numbers peaking in the mid-1960s. Care for elderly members was provided largely by younger ones. Over time, however, the number of vocations decreased while lifespans increased. The result is fewer younger members available to support the retirement and eldercare needs of senior members. Currently, 71% of the religious communities have a median age of 70 or older.


