On The Way

Christmas: Hope Fulfilled and Furthered

One of the most beautiful Christmas carols, *O Little Town of Bethlehem*, sings of that graced place, "The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight." That small town, unknown except for the birth of Christ, becomes the crossroads for all of humanity's fundamental sentiments. By his birth, our hopes are fulfilled. They meet our fears and triumph over them. This day brings Advent's hope to fulfillment. The waiting, watching, preparing, and praying of the past four weeks all realize their purpose at the birth of Christ.

The Israelites, whom the prophet Zechariah describes as "prisoners of hope," are freed from their confinement. Their Messiah and Lord, as foretold by all the prophets, has come into the world to free them from sin, lead them out of slavery, and bring them into his Kingdom.

But it's greater than just that, because Israel is a microcosm of the whole world and all of history. In the Israelites and their waiting, we should see every person and every people, longing for freedom from sin, hoping to be saved from death and brought into life.

The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight. We should bring our fears to Bethlehem, to the crib of the Savior. Whatever burdens and frightens us is met by him, the object and fulfillment of our hopes. Let us contemplate the Christ Child and consider how, despite so many difficulties and dangers, his birth was richly provided for – with angels and animals and a loving father and mother around him. This puts our fears in perspective. We will never encounter a trial, challenge, or struggle beyond the reach of our Father. Because the Son of God is born into this world, we have confidence in the Father's divine assistance here and now.

At the same time, the birth of Christ stretches our hope beyond this world. He has come and made his dwelling among us so that we in turn can make our dwelling with him. Christian hope draws its inspiration from Christ's life, beginning with his Birth. But it reaches further, into eternity. He is born in this world so that we can be born into eternity. By his birth he fulfills the promises of old so that we can hope more confidently in the promises of grace and eternity.

So, our entire Advent exercise of hope was meant for more than just one season. It was a season of training focused primarily on Christmas but looking into heaven itself. Strengthened in hope by those weeks of preparation, we can better hope for the last coming of Christ and the eternal dwellings he will grant to those who give him a dwelling place here.

Dear friends, may the birth of Christ confirm and increase your hope to receive "grace upon grace" (Jn 1:16). In the midst of our culture's indulgence, may the poverty of his birth enrich you with all spiritual riches. In the midst of the world's busyness, may the peace announced by the angels be yours. In the midst of the world's noise, may the silence of this night settle your hearts.

Please know of my gratitude, and that of all the priests at Saint James, for your prayers and generosity. A special thanks to all the volunteers who serve the parish so generously throughout the years but especially at this time. May the Lord bless you all with a joyful and merry Christmas!

Rectory and Administrative Offices' Christmas Schedule

If you need assistance with funeral arrangements before the office opens again on Tuesday, January 3rd, email Susan Ramsel, <u>sramsel@stjamescatholic.org</u>, and include a daytime phone number.

Reminder on Parish Sacraments

- **Baptism Classes**—Baptisms are held weekly but registration is required through the Rectory office in advance. Both parents are required to attend an instructional session before the baptism. Details and information will be provided about baptism at that scheduled session. Contact Ginny Beauchamp, <u>gbeauchamp@stjamescatholic.org</u>, in the office or visit our website, <u>stjamescatholic.org/sacraments/baptism</u>.
- **Weddings**—Marriage preparation is a six month program. Note: The Sanctuary Restoration and Renewal Project will impact the scheduling of weddings (January through April). Please call the office for further information.
- **Funeral Planning**—The first step in planning a funeral should be to contact a funeral home. The funeral home will coordinate with the church to plan the date and time and contact the music director. The priest who celebrates the funeral Mass will contact the family to set up a meeting with the family and to discuss details of the Mass.
- Anointing of the Sick—Parishioners can request this sacrament of healing for themselves or a loved one by calling the Rectory office at 703-532-8815. For an emergency requiring the sacraments of the Church outside of office hours, call our office and follow the menu prompts for the priests' emergency line. This sacrament is not limited to those near death and may be received more than once by a person who is ill or suffering.

Register for WorkCamp 2023 Before January 15th

Registration for WorkCamp is open for all high school teens currently in grades 9-12. WorkCamp will be held from June 17-23, 2023, in Frederick County, Virginia. In addition to attending the entire week of camp, teens are required to attend four preparation meetings and participate in fundraising activities. The cost is \$525, but the fundraising covers a large part of this. Each parent should plan to volunteer in some way such as helping with fundraising, spending one afternoon at camp as a security volunteer, being a crew leader, or helping in some other way. The deadline to register is January 15th.

Adult volunteers are needed as well. We need to secure adult volunteers since the number of students is limited based on the number of adult volunteers. We need one adult female crew leader for every 1-5 girls, one adult male crew leader for every 1-5 boys, and one contractor for every 1-5 teens. If you are 25 or older, please consider volunteering as a crew leader to join us for the week, or if you have basic home repair or building skills, please consider volunteering your time as a contractor (Monday-Thursday). WorkCamp is a big commitment, but it comes with lots of personal rewards. Email Karen Graffam, <u>klgraffam@gmail.com</u>, if you are interested in participating.
