On The Way

A Catechesis on Marriage: Freedom

We don't immediately associate freedom and marriage. We have phrases that describe just the opposite, like "tying the knot" and "the old ball and chain." Still, we know that freedom is essential to marriage, if only at its start. Suppose you went to a wedding and noticed that the groom was being forced at gunpoint to speak the vows. You would doubt the validity of the marriage, and with good reason.

A marriage is validly contracted by the free exchange of vows by both the bride and the groom. Unlike some other religions and cultures that might base a marriage's validity on the groom's consent alone, the Church insists on the equal dignity and consent of both. Freedom for marriage means that nothing (for example, a prior marriage) impedes the bride and groom and that nothing (for example, a shotgun) forces them. If this freedom is lacking, there is no marriage.

This insistence on freedom explains why the Church requires preparation for marriage. The priest preparing an engaged couple has the responsibility to confirm their freedom. If he discerns that there is some impediment and/or coercion, he cannot continue with the wedding. Even in the wedding rite itself, prior to the vows, the officiant asks the couple: "Have you come here to enter into Marriage without coercion, freely, and wholeheartedly?"

In one sense, freedom ends with the vows. The spouses are profoundly bound to one another and aren't free, as they once were, to see other people or to end the relationship. On the other hand, in two significant senses, freedom doesn't end with the vows.

First, to vow oneself *completes* freedom. Many young people, with their "fear of missing out," hold back from binding themselves in marriage because they think that means the end of freedom. Not so. Vows fulfill freedom, which realizes its purpose in self-gift. If we don't use freedom to give ourselves, then it wastes away (even as we think we've preserved it).

Second, the free gift-of-self in the exchange of vows should continue throughout married life. Spouses should always serve one another *freely*, that is, with generosity, joy, and love. Unfortunately, many spouses who freely give themselves to each other at the wedding later behave as slaves in marriage. They don't fulfill their duties and obligations joyfully and wholeheartedly but slavishly.

In fact, we have the ability to do freely what we're obligated to do. Marriage brings a lot of obligations, from trivial things like taking out the trash to grave matters such as caring for a seriously ill child. Spouses should take up those duties not as slaves but freely, with generosity and even joy.

The freedom of marriage is seen in a transcendent and perfect manner in the union between Christ and the Church. The Bridegroom Jesus Christ gives himself freely to the Church. Nothing impedes or compels his gift-of-self: "I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down on my own. I have power to lay it down, and power to take it up again" (Jn 10:17-18). And he desires that the Church give herself freely to him. He doesn't force our faith and love but gives us the grace to respond to his invitation freely.

When spouses strive to live their vows freely – generously, joyfully, wholeheartedly – they witness to the free gift-of-self that exists between Christ and the Church and, in a sense, make it present.

Feast of Saint Blaise February 3rd




Natural Family Planning Group


