

## *Catechesis on the Church: The Church as Mother*

**On The Way** 

An ancient term for the Church is that of *Mother*. Now, this is more than an image. We use this for the Church differently from the way people might refer to their college as "alma mater" (loving mother) or their country as the "Motherland." More than just an analogy or metaphor, this term expresses a spiritual reality. Indeed, it's an extension of the truth of the Church as the Bride of Christ. He espouses her to himself and, by his grace and truth, makes her fruitful in bearing life, in bringing forth new Christians.

This understanding of the Church comes from the concept of spiritual motherhood that we find throughout scripture. In the Old Testament, the city of Jerusalem was referred to as Mother (cf. Is 66:11), because as a mother the holy city brought forth and nourished life by its worship and teachings. When looking upon Jerusalem, Jesus speaks of his own mission in maternal terms: "How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings" (Lk 13:34). Saint Paul likewise describes his ministry as motherhood. "We were gentle among you, as a nursing mother cares for her children," he writes to the Thessalonians (1 Thess 2:7). And to the rebellious Galatians, "My children, for whom I am again in labor until Christ be formed in you!" (Gal 4:19)

So, it was natural and reasonable for Christians to regard the Church as Mother. In the ancient Church, this was captured by Saint Cyprian's famous words: "No one can have God for his Father, who has not the Church for his mother." To be Christian means to belong to this family, the household of God.

This emphasizes the Church as the place and, in a sense, the person that brings us new birth and nourishes our new life. Baptism, the sacrament of rebirth, is in the Church and under her authority. Likewise, the Eucharist, our divine nourishment, is properly received from the Church and in union with the Church. Children of God are always at their Mother's table for supper! As a mother, the Church not only bears and nourishes life, but also heals and teaches. So, we find healing power in the Church's sacrament of Penance as well as in her prayers and blessings. Finally, Mother Church holds the fullness of the Christian faith, by which she instructs and forms her children.

Another way of approaching this mystery is to consider the greatest spiritual mother, the Virgin Mary. One theologian calls her the "mirror of the Church." In her we find the perfect embodiment of the Church. As Mary is to the Son of God, so the Church is to the children of God. As our Lady conceived, bore, nourished, and raised the Christ, so the Church - by word and sacrament conceives, bears, nourishes, and raises Christians.

Finally, the images of Bride of Christ and Mother of Christians help us understand and appreciate religious women - sisters and nuns – as icons of the Church. When a woman enters religious life, she doesn't just sign up for a job. She is espoused to Christ as his bride. She foregoes marriage to be completed devoted to Jesus Christ the Bridegroom, with "undivided devotion" (1 Cor 7:35). Similarly, she foregoes natural motherhood to embrace spiritual motherhood, so that by her prayers, sacrifices, and good works she - like the Church – can bring forth and nurture new spiritual life.

## Maintenance Fund Collection in Honor of Monsignor Paul V. Heller


