- Saint James School opened its doors in 1906 for \$1.00 per month in tuition.
- The school was initially administered by the Sisters of Perpetual Adoration, who were known for their love and devotion to the Eucharist.
- On September 17, 1923 the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (IHM) took over the administration of our school; they were known as strong and innovative educators.
- We are the first and only Catholic school in the Arlington Diocese to receive three Blue Ribbon awards for academic excellence.
- We renovated our library to foster a love of reading for all students.
- Our virtue program helps our students live the Gospel in word and deed.
- Our goal is to be known as a "school for all learners." To that end, we have created a peer mentor program for our students with cognitive disabilities.



Dear Friends in Christ.

HE THEME FOR THE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR is "Walking with Saint James." As the patron of our parish and school, Saint James is a faithful companion on life's journey. The Way of Saint James is a pilgrimage that concludes in the Spanish city of Santiago de Compostela at the tomb of Saint James. The idea of pilgrimage is a beautiful metaphor for our journey as a school community. On "The Way" each pilgrim bears signs of pilgrimage: their backpack, their walking stick, and the shell marked with the Cross of Saint James.

Like the pilgrim, our students carry backpacks but theirs are full of books and they weigh on students. Likewise, learning requires effort and perseverance. When our students are stretched, they grow in knowledge and grace, and this is how they become Saints! Our backpacks get heavy at times, which makes us weary and sore. But this also strengthens our trust in God's Divine Providence.

Like the pilgrim, we carry a walking stick, though ours does not come from a tree--we lean on our Catholic faith to give us the strength we need to carry on when things get difficult. The sacraments serve as a walking stick. When students fail, the sacrament of reconciliation gets them back on their feet again. When students are hungry, they are fed by the Eucharist, which gives them strength for the journey. They know to look to Jesus Christ as their guide.

Like the pilgrim, we carry the Cross of Saint James. Our school logo presents this red cross as our identity. It preaches Christ's death and resurrection, and is a sword that symbolizes the defense of our faith in Christ.

A casual observer might think these pilgrims are identical because they carry the same instruments and wear the same uniforms. But this could not be further from the truth. *Each pilgrim is beautifully and wonderfully made by God!* We share the common bonds of suffering, the threads of adventure, and a search for deeper meaning. As a fellow pilgrim, I say to you, "*Buen Camino!*" as we walk this road of life, love, and faith together.
